

**NOTES OF MEETINGS OF THE STATUTORY LICENSING
REGULATORY BOARD SUB COMMITTEE**

- 1 **Present:** Councillors C Wraith (Chairman), Tracey Cheetham and Worton together with Councillor Frost (Reserve Member).

2. **Declarations of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary Interest**

There were no declarations of pecuniary or non-pecuniary interest from Members in respect of items on the agenda.

3. **Application to vary a Premises Licence – The Royal, Barnsley Road, Brugh Green, Barnsley**

The Panel considered an application for a variation to the premises licence in respect of The Royal, Barnsley Road, Barugh Green, Barnsley which was located within close proximity to a residential area.

After hearing all the evidence presented including representations made by Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties, the Sub-Committee decided that in view of there being no prejudice to the Licensing Objectives, the application to vary the Licence be approved in accordance with the proposals contained within the Operating Schedule detailed within the report and subject to the additional condition proposed by the Pollution Control Service and to which the applicant agreed and which was detailed in writing as follows:

‘All live an recorded music performed outdoors will cease no later than 10.00 pm and that these activities will be limited to the months of April to September. Also, noise from any live performance of recorded music should not be noticeable above the normal background noise in any habitable room of the nearest noise sensitive premises.’

5. **Declarations of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary Interest**

6. **Application for a Review of the Premises Licence – The Digital Bar, Wellington Street, Barnsley**

The Panel considered an application by the South Yorkshire Police for a review of the Premises Licence in respect of The Digital Bar, Wellington Street, Barnsley.

After hearing all the evidence presented including representations made, the Sub-Committee considered this application in the context of the Licensing Objectives and particularly Objectives:

- 1 The Prevention of Crime and Disorder; and
- 2 Public Safety

In the absence of evidence by the South Yorkshire Police to support their claims and in particular, the non disclosure of the Police Incident Logs, the decision of the Sub-Committee was that no action be taken in respect of the premises licence

The decision of the Sub-Committee was unanimous.
