REVIEW OF TAXI LICENSING

(1) RE-ADOPTION OF PART II LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT 1976

(2) AMALGAMATION OF EXISTING HACKNEY CARRIAGE LICENSING ZONES PURSUANT TO SCHEDULE 14, PART 2, PARAGRAPH 25 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1972

1. Purpose of the report

1.1 In response to the Licensing review exercise, this report sets out the details of the proposal to:

- (a) Re-adopt the provisions of Part II of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 ("the 1976 Act") within the Borough of Barnsley, and
- (b) Amalgamate existing hackney carriage licensing zones to create a single taxi zone for taxi licensing within the Borough of Barnsley pursuant to Schedule 14, Part 2, Paragraph 25 of the Local Government Act 1972 ("the 1972 Act").

2. Recommendations

2.1 It is recommended that Cabinet:

- i) Endorse the proposal in pursuance of Section 45(2) of Part II of the 1976 Act, that the Full Council pass a resolution to re-adopt the provisions of Part II of the 1976 Act which shall apply throughout the Borough of Barnsley with effect from 1st August 2013
- ii) Endorse the proposal that the Full Council pass a resolution pursuant to Schedule 14, Part 2, Paragraph 25 of the 1972 Act, to amalgamate existing hackney carriage licensing zones and

apply section 171(4) of the Public Health Act 1875 throughout the Borough of Barnsley with effect from 1st August 2013.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 At a meeting of the Full Council held on 28 February 2013, the Council resolved to re-adopt the provisions of Part II of the 1976 Act as part of its recent licensing review. Part II of the 1976 Act contains provisions relating to the licensing of private hire and hackney carriage vehicles, drivers and operators. A relevant Minute of that meeting is attached at Appendix 1.
- 3.2 Re-adoption of the 1976 Act was proposed for the purposes of clarification for the future without prejudice to the Council's previous adoption made pursuant to the above provisions of the 1976 Act; and to ensure certainty in any enforcement action taken under the legislation.
- 3.3 At the same for time for completeness in the Council's licensing review exercise and again to ensure certainty in any enforcement action undertaken it is thought prudent to propose a further resolution to be passed pursuant to Schedule 14, Part 2, Paragraph 25 of the 1972 Act. The effect of the resolution is to apply section 171(4) of the Public Health Act 1875 and amalgamate existing hackney carriage licensing zones into a single hackney carriage licensing zone within the Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley thereby allowing hackney carriages licensed by the Council to ply for hire within the whole of its area.

4. Legal Implications/Consultation

(i) Re-adoption of the 1976 Act

- 4.1 Section 45(2) of the 1976 Act provides that if the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 is in force in the area of a district council, the council may resolve that the provisions of Part II of the 1976 Act (other than section 45), are to apply to the relevant area; and if the council do so resolve those provisions shall come into force in the relevant area on the day specified in that behalf in the resolution (which must not be before the expiration of the period of one month beginning with the day on which the resolution is passed). "The relevant area" for these purposes mean: (a) if the Act of 1847 is in force throughout the area of the council, that area; and (b) if the Act of 1847 is in force for part only of the area of the council that part of that area.
- 4.2 Section 45(3) of the 1976 Act provides that a council shall not pass a resolution adopting Part II of the 1976 Act unless it has (a) published a notice of its intention to pass the resolution in a local newspaper circulating the area for two consecutive weeks; and (b) served a copy

of the notice, not later than the date on which it is first published in the newspaper, on each parish or community council within the area to be affected.

(ii) Resolution pursuant to Schedule 14, Part 2, Paragraph 25 of the 1972 Act

- 4.3 Paragraph 25(5) of Schedule 14 of the 1972 Act provides that a council shall not pass a resolution unless it has given the requisite notice of its intention by (a) publicising notice of its intention to pass the resolution in a local newspaper circulating the area for two consecutive weeks; and (b) a copy of the notice is served, not later than the date on which it is first published in the newspaper, on each parish or community council within the area to be affected.
- 4.4 Notices in respect of both matters were served on all 18 Parish/ Town Councils affected within the Borough of Barnsley on 25 April 2013 together with an explanatory letter; 16 of which were served via email and 2 who did not have email addresses were served by post. (Appendix 2).
- 4.5 Advertisements in respect of both matters were published in the Barnsley Chronicle:
- 4.5.1 The advertisements were first published on 3 May 2013. (Appendix 3).
- 4.5.2 The second advertisements were published on 10 May 2013. (Appendix 4).
- 4.6 The Council has therefore complied with the legislative requirements in giving requisite notice for both matters
- 4.7 **Note** – Following consultation the Council must now by resolution formally agree to (a) adopt Part II of the 1976 Act and (b) resolve to amalgamate existing hackney carriage zones; both of which will then come into effect one month after the passing of the adoption/resolution.

5. **Financial Implications**

- 5.1 The cost implication relating to the publication of the statutory notices (£232.96 plus VAT per advert) has been met from the Council's Licensing Section budget.

1. Notice of Intention to Adopt Part II of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976

As part of Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council's ("the Council") recent licensing review, it resolved at its meeting of the Full Council on 28 February 2013 to re-adopt the provisions of Part II of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 ("the 1976 Act") within the Borough. Part II of the 1976 Act contains provisions relating to the licensing of private hire and hackney carriage vehicles, drivers and operators.

The re-adoption of the 1976 Act is proposed for the purposes of clarification for the future without prejudice to the Council's previous adoption made pursuant to the above provisions of the 1976 Act; and to ensure certainty in any enforcement action taken under the legislation.

Section 45(3) of the 1976 Act provides that a council shall not pass a resolution adopting Part II of the 1976 Act unless it has (a) published a notice of its intention to pass the resolution in a local newspaper circulating the area for two consecutive weeks; and (b) served a copy of the notice, not later than the date on which it is first published in the newspaper, on each parish or community council within the area to be affected.

Accordingly please find enclosed for your information Notice pursuant to the provisions of the 1976 Act; the purpose of which is to ensure compliance with the notification requirements. A copy of the Notice will be published in the Barnsley Chronicle for 2 consecutive weeks commencing from 3 May 2013.

The resolution is intended to be passed at the Council's meeting scheduled to take place on 13 June 2013. This will have the effect of confirming that from 1st August 2013 the Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley as a 'controlled district' for the purposes of the 1976 Act, thus empowering the Council to control the licensing of hackney carriage and private hire vehicles from the said date.

2. Notice of Intention to Pass a Resolution under the Local Government Act 1972 Schedule 14 Part 2, Paragraph 25

In addition at the same time the Council for completeness intends to pass a resolution pursuant to Schedule 14, Part 2, Paragraph 25 of the Local Government Act 1972 ("the 1972 Act"), that section 171(4) of the Public Health Act 1875 shall apply throughout the whole of its area.

The effect of the resolution is to amalgamate existing hackney carriage licensing zones into a single hackney carriage licensing zone with the Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley.

Paragraph 25 of Schedule 14 of the 1972 provides that a council shall not pass a resolution unless it has given the requisite notice of its intention by (a) publicising notice of its intention to pass the resolution in a local newspaper circulating the area for two consecutive weeks; and (b) a copy of the notice is served, not later than the date on which it is first published in the newspaper, on each parish or community council within the area to be affected.


