APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE

KG's Sports Bar & Social Club, Kelvin Grove, Wombwell, Barnsley

1 Background

- 1.1 On 11 May 2012, an application under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 was received from Hazel J Pilkington, Durfeldt Lodge, Barnsley Road, Darfield, Barnsley. A copy of this application is attached as Appendix 1.
- 1.2 Members are requested to determine the application for a premises licence.
- 1.3 The premise currently operates under a Club Premises Certificate and is located within close proximity of a residential area.

2 Application for Premises Licence

- 2.1 The proposed application requests the licence takes effect as soon as possible and requests the following licensable activities and opening times:

a) Indoor Sporting Events

Monday to Sunday 11.00 – 02.00

b) Live Music

Monday to Sunday 11.00 – 02.00 indoors

c) Recorded Music

Monday to Sunday 11.00 - 02.00 indoors

d) Provision of Facilities for Dancing

Monday to Sunday 11.00 – 02.00 indoors

e) Supply of Alcohol

Monday to Sunday 11.00 – 02.00 indoors

j) Opening Times

Monday to Sunday 11.00 – 02.00 indoors

3 Promotion of Licensing Objectives

- 3.1 The applicant has set out the steps intended to be taken in order to promote the four licensing objectives, if the proposed premises licence is granted.

a) General – all four licensing objectives

The licensing objectives have been carefully considered in the light of the proposed application, taking into account the venue and the site location.

Details of any measures considered necessary to promote the licensing objectives are contained under the relevant objective below.

‘All staff trained to promote the licensing objectives.’

b) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

‘Door staff SIA registered and CCTV recording 24 hours.’

c) Public Safety

‘SIA registered door staff. CCTV in operation. Recordings kept available for inspection.’

d) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

‘No outside speakers. SIA registered door staff. Entry refused to intoxicated individuals – customer notices to leave quietly.’

e) The Protection of Children from Harm

'Challenge 25 Policy in operation.'

4 Responsible Authorities

- 4.1 No representations have been received from Responsible Authorities under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.2 However, Senior Environmental Health Officer, Lucy Allen, contacted the applicant recommending alcohol sales cease prior to the proposed closing time in order to give customers a 'drinking up time'. This would result in sales of alcohol ceasing at 01:30 and the premises closing at 02:00. This would also allow for a staggered process as customers would not leave at the same time, thus reducing the risk of noise nuisance to nearby residents.
- 4.3 Furthermore, South Yorkshire Police Licensing Department has also recommended that a refusals book be maintained at all times.
- 4.4 Members are minded to note that the applicant, Mrs Pilkington has agreed to both recommendations being conditioned to the premise licence, if granted.

5 Interested Parties

- 5.1 Following publication of the statutory notice of the application for the premises licence in the local press and the display of notices at the premises, a number of representations have been received from interested parties. - 5.3 Valid representations which relate to one of more of the four licensing objectives are attached as Appendix 2.
- 5.4 Under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, representations can be made by anyone whether or not they live or have a business interest within the vicinity of the premises where the application has been made. However, in this case interested parties concerned do reside close to, if not within the immediate vicinity of where the application has been made.
- 5.5 Each representation sets out a number of areas for concern in relation to the licensing objectives and a précis these are provided overleaf:

- a) Criminal damage caused during the weekends and bank holidays to properties and cars has been immense
- b) Cars being vandalised, glasses smashed all over the road, vomit and other bodily fluid
- c) Number of people coming into garden and witnessed urinating
- d) We have to clean up empty glass bottles and general waste
- e) In preparation for the use of the church building, we regularly need to clear up bottles and glasses, a number of which have been broken, along with human vomit, urine and excrement
- f) Already subject to late night shouting, violence, hazardous litter and indecent behaviour

6 Compatibility with the European Convention on Human Rights

The decision of the Board will amount to a determination of the Council and the rights of the applicant. Therefore, as far as it is possible to do so, the board must comply with the requirements of Article 6 (the right to a fair trial). This means the applicant and should be afforded the right to make oral representations at the meeting.

If Members determine to refuse the application, it is necessary for the reasons to be clearly stated.

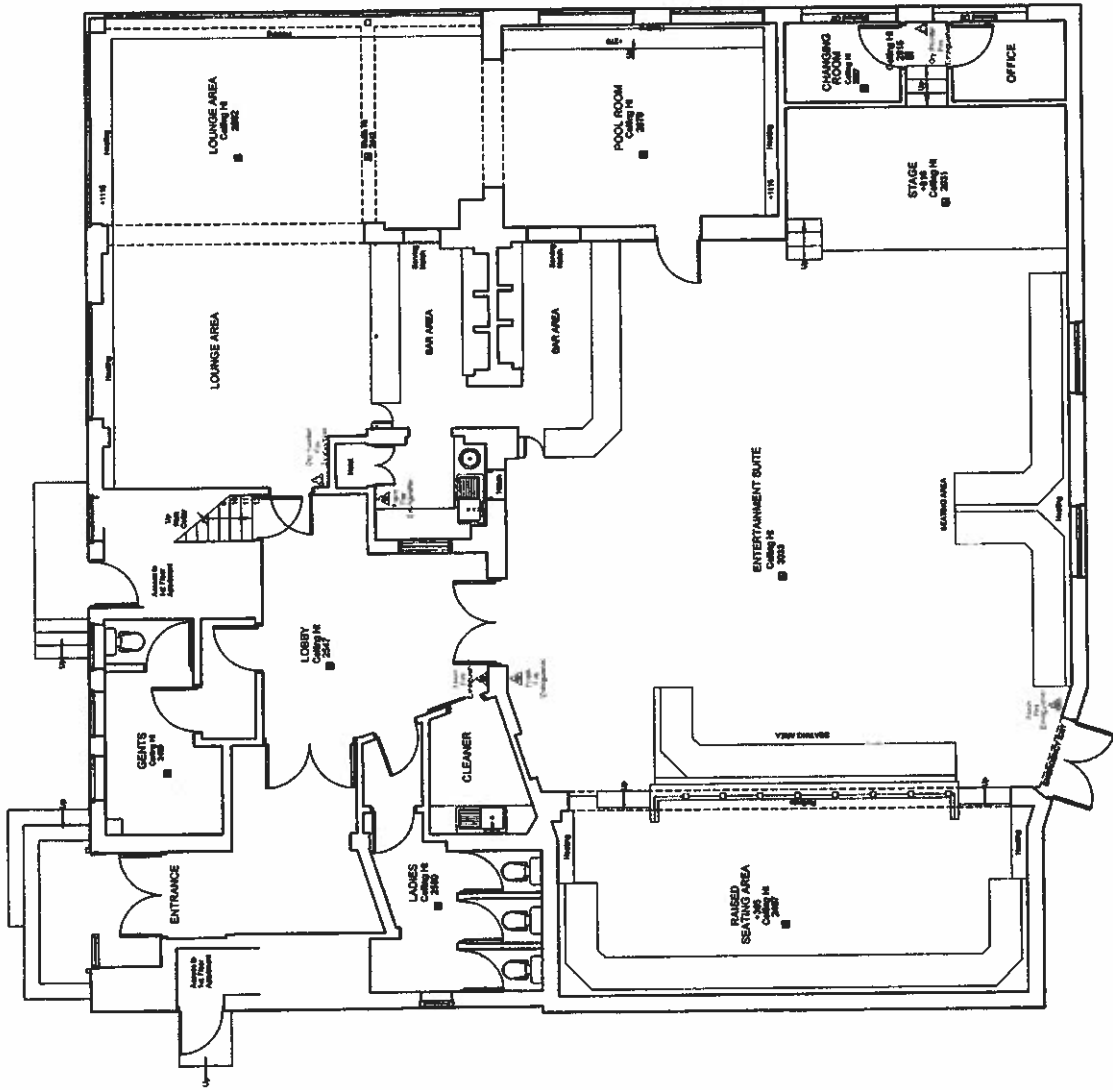

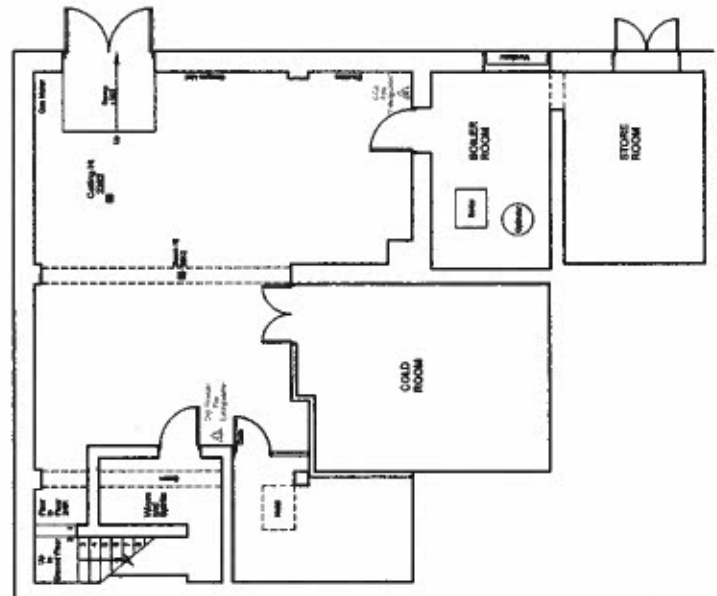

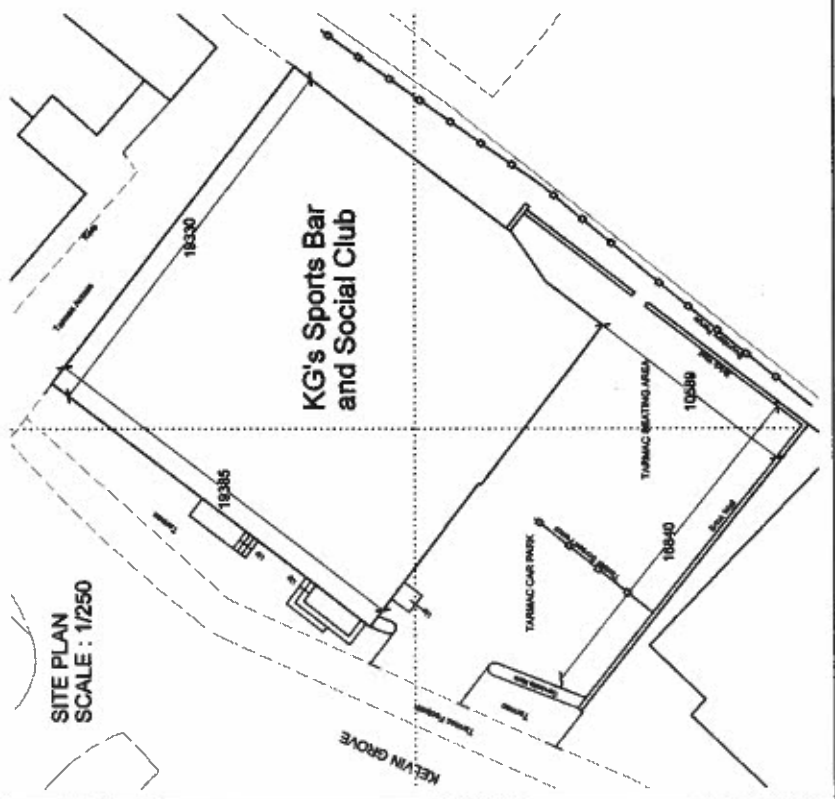

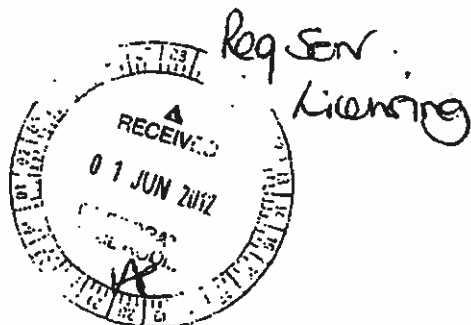


LOCATION PLAN

Re: The application made by Hazel Jean Pilkington for a new premises licence in respect of KG's Sports Bar and Social Club, Kelvin Grove, Wombwell.

I am opposed to the extension of opening hours applied for on the grounds that it would give further scope for the disturbance and distress already being created for local residents by visitors to this bar. We are already subject to late night shouting, noisy violence, dangerous litter and indecent behaviour.

KG's is situated in a residential street which is mainly of family homes. The former doctors' surgery, next to KG's, is in the process of being converted to provide bed-sit accommodation.

With its present licensing hours, KG's already attracts customers who have previously been drinking in other establishments. Some of them bring their drinks with them, ignoring the fact that 'Under the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001, the consumption of alcohol in the area is prohibited.' They bring glasses, cans and bottles which they leave on walls and in gardens, some being deliberately smashed. They also make a lot of noise.

On occasions the number trying to get into the club is so large that they fill the full width of the street. Even without the aggression which sometimes comes when people have had too much to drink, the noise made by groups as they meet up with friends, finish their cigarettes etc. is more than we should have to put up with late at night when we are trying to sleep.

The following are typical of the kinds of behaviour we have to endure.

- Last Saturday night I was so disturbed by what I could hear that I got out of bed. It was just after half-past eleven and a young man, apparently intoxicated, was shouting abuse at a girl who was sitting on my garden wall. Although friends were trying to keep them apart, the noise continued for some time.
- Earlier this year, two men were so determined to fight that it took some time for their friends to separate them. Again there was a lot of noise.
- Sometimes, blows are struck: I was driving down the street past a group on the pavement when two men who were fighting fell onto the road just in front of my car and continued to thump one another. I had to back out of the way and wait for the SNT to arrive before I could garage my car.
- I have also seen both men and women urinating on my property.

Further to the Public Notice regarding the application from KG's Sports and Social Club Kelvin Grove Wombwell to extend their Licensed opening hours -

On behalf of the Parochial Church Council [PCC] of St Mary's Wombwell, I wish to register our concerns and offer the following comments:

The PCC are responsible for St Mary's church building and also Wombwell Community Hall, Church Street Wombwell, which are public buildings accessed by a private road linking Church Street and Kelvin Grove.

Whilst many of the meetings held in these buildings are open to the public, there are also specific groups for children, the elderly, the vulnerable and those with special needs. The Church building is used for special occasions such as weddings baptisms and funerals.

In preparation for the use of the church building, we regularly need to clear up bottles and glasses, a number of which have been broken, along with human vomit, urine and excrement. Members of our congregation in the past have seen some of the offenders either leaving or entering KG's. The PCC therefore believe that extending opening hours would only exacerbate this public nuisance problem.

Furthermore, although the church drive-way is clearly marked as a private road, we have witnessed a number of occasions when groups of adults have used it as a cut through, from or to, KG's Sports and Social Club.

In addition, although access and parking is clearly marked as being for church use only, other vehicles [including taxis dropping passengers off] use this private road as a cut through between Church Street and Kelvin Grove. These vehicles are often driven at relatively high speeds. The PCC consider that an extension to the opening hours at KG's Sports and Social Club would increase the misuse of this access, and prove to be especially dangerous for children and the vulnerable, and we can also foresee some difficulties when weddings and funerals are taking place.

The PCC therefore wish these considerations be taken into account with regard to this application
