LICENSING ACT 2003

APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE The Royal, Barnsley Road, Barugh Green, Barnsley

1 Background

- 1.1 On 21 October 2014, an application under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 was received from Mr Nigel West, 8 Salisbury Street, Barnsley S75 2TL. A copy of this application is attached as Appendix 1.
 - Members are minded to note that the aforementioned licence application became valid on 29 October 2014 when a revised copy of the premise plan was submitted.
- 1.2 Members are requested to determine the application to vary the premise licence.
- 1.3 The premise is located on a main road and within close proximity to a residential area.

2 Application for Premises Licence

- 2.1 The proposed application to vary requests the licence takes effect as soon as possible and requests the following revised licensable activities and opening times:
 - b) Live Music (Indoors/Outdoors)

Sunday to Thursday 11.00 – 22.00

Friday to Saturday 11.00 - 23.00

*Acoustic music with vocals with low amplification – normally inside the premise but also in the beer garden during the summer months – no music outside after dusk

c) Recorded Music (Indoors/Outdoors)

Monday to Thursday 11.00 - 01.00

Friday to Saturday 11.00 - 02.00

Sunday 11.00 - 23.00

d) Supply of Alcohol (Indoors/Outdoors)

Monday to Thursday 11.00 - 01.00

Friday to Saturday 11.00 – 02.00

Sunday 11.00 – 23.00

j) Opening Times

Monday to Thursday 11.00 - 01.30

Friday to Saturday 11.00 - 02.30

Sunday 11.00 - 23.30

3 Promotion of Licensing Objectives

3.1 The applicant has set out the steps intended to be taken in order to promote the four licensing objectives, if the proposed premises licence is granted.

a) General - all four licensing objectives

The licensing objectives have been carefully considered in the light of the proposed application, taking into account the venue and the site location.

Details of any measures considered necessary to promote the licensing objectives are contained under the relevant objective below.

'I have undertaken my own risk assessment.'

b) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

'CCTV installed both internally and externally. Zero tolerance drugs policy. In-house training re: drugs and dealing with drunken people to all members of staff.'

c) Public Safety

'CCTV installed. Exterior lighting provided. Fire protection system installed to meet latest standards and maintained by my authorised agent. All emergency exits clearly marked.'

d) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

'CCTV installed. Signage at exit doors to remind customers to be quiet when leaving and respect the local residents. All windows and internal doors to remain closed by 11.00pm. Any music played outside will cease at dusk.'

e) The Protection of Children from Harm

'All staff trained to prevent sale of alcohol to under 18's and relevant proof taken where doubt of under 21. Children under 16 will not be permitted after 21.00 unless with an adult or dining or at a private function. The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply – no other risks found.'

4 Responsible Authorities

- 4.1 Representations have been received from Senior Pollution Officer, Mr Paul Denton in relation to live and recorded music to be played externally, as set out in Appendix 2.
- 4.2 However, Members are minded to note that under the Live Music Act 2012, live amplified music that takes place in a beer garden is exempt from licensing requirements; provided that the beer garden concerned is included in the licence and the performance takes place between 08:00 and 23:00 on the same day and before an audience of 200 people or fewer. In essence, this means that unless the application is completely

rejected, Mr West would still be able to stage performances of live music in his beer garden. Alternatively, Mr West could remove the provision of live music outdoors from his application and simply operate under the Live Music Act.

5 Interested Parties

- 5.1 Following the publication of the statutory notice of the application for the premises licence in the local press and the display of notices at the premises, representations have been received from interested parties.
 - In total, 2 representations have been received.
- 5.2 The valid representations have been received from:
 - Councillor Margaret Bruff, Barugh Green, Barnsley
 - Councillor Linda Burgess, Darton West Ward
- 5.3 Valid representations which relate to one of more of the four licensing objectives are attached as Appendix 3.
- 5.4 Under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, representations can be made by anyone whether or not they live or have a business interest within the vicinity of the premises where the application has been made. However, in this case one interested party concerned in this matter does reside in the Barugh Green area where the application has been made.
- 5.5 Each representation sets out a number of areas for concern in relation to the licensing objectives and a précis these are provided below:
 - a) Residents already have problems with loud music even from as far away as the Post Office (Junction 38) at times
 - b) There are residential properties close to the Royal and we would ask that any approval for live or recorded music is limited to reasonable hours for residents
 - c) There are working people living nearby who should able to have a reasonable night's sleep and also families with children who would be disturbed by loud music at night time

6 Compatibility with the European Convention on Human Rights

The decision of the Board will amount to a determination of the Council and the rights of the applicant. Therefore, as far as it is possible to do so, the board must comply with the requirements of Article 6 (the right to a fair trial). This means the applicant and should be afforded the right to make oral representations at the meeting.

If Members determine to refuse the application, it is necessary for the reasons to be clearly stated.

I have looked at the above application and I have a few concerns. In the past complaints have been received about noise from the Royal and this was under its current licence that doesn't have any outside entertainment, live entertainment and restricted hours. However I am aware that the premises have under gone a complete change of direction and the focus is more on food rather than a drinking pub with a disco, but I'm not happy with 7 days a week live/recorded music outside? I don't have a problem with the extension of the hours internally and the addition of live music, especially with their proposal for all doors and windows to remain closed after 11pm.

Within the application form it mentions recorded music being back ground if this is what is required, particularly outside I would suggest that this doesn't require a licence and thus an indirect route of preventing loud amplified music outside? Also I think they would be covered under the Live Music act for what they are proposing to do, in relation to live music outside?

So in conclusion I want to object against the variation to allow outdoor live and recorded music as proposed in the application on the grounds of public nuisance and based on the fact that the premises is very close to residential properties.
