# **LICENSING ACT 2003**

# APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE The Old Post Office, Huddersfield Road, Barnsley, S75 4DE

# 1. Background

- On 29 March 2011, an application under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 was received from Mr Brendan West of The Old Post Office, Huddersfield Road, Barnsley. Copy of this application is attached as Appendix 1.
- 1.2 Members are minded to note that due to the applicant's failure to display public notices advertising the proposed changes to the premise licence, this application was not deemed to be valid until 14 April 2011.
- 1.3 Members are requested to determine the application to vary the premise licence.
- 1.4 The Old Post Office is a large public house located amongst open fields and within close proximity to residential dwellings.

# 2 Application for Premises Licence

2.1 The proposed application requests the licence to take effect as soon as possible and requests the following changes to licensable activities and opening times:

# a) Live Music (Indoors/Outdoors)

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 02.00

\* Maximum of five events to be held each year and external music to cease at midnight

# b) Recorded Music (Indoors/Outdoors)

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 02.00

\* Maximum of five events to be held each year and external music to cease at midnight

# c) Performance of Dance (Indoors/Outdoors)

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 02.00

\* Maximum of five events to be held each year

# d) Provision of Facilities for Dancing (Indoors/Outdoors)

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 02.00

\* Maximum of five events to be held each year

# e) Late Night Refreshment (Indoors/Outdoors)

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 02.00

\* Licence required to serve hot food/drinks between 23.00 – 02.00 only

# f) Supply of Alcohol (Indoors/Outdoors)

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 02.00

\* Sales of alcohol to be served everyday 23.30 and only extended during large scale events

# g) Opening Times

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 02.00

\* Opening times to be extended until 02.00 when large scale events taking place only. Also like to extend hours to include use of private indoor function rooms

# 3 Promotion of Licensing Objectives

3.1 The applicant has set out the steps intended to be taken in order to promote the four licensing objectives, if the proposed premises licence is granted.

The licensing objectives have been considered in the light of the proposed application, taking into account the premises and the site location.

Details of any measures considered necessary to promote the licensing objectives are contained under the relevant objective below.

# a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

'The organisers for each event will be asked to provide an event plan. We are also using very experienced event organisers who deal regularly with large in and outdoor events. Events aimed at 18-40 year olds, playing very unique music to attract young professionals to have a good time. All surrounding areas will be cleaned and swept professionally the following day'.

# b) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

'Due to our very good relationship with South Yorkshire Police and the fact we are part of Darton Pub Watch proves prevention of crime and disorder is very important to us. We display clearly our Challenge 21 act and also anti-drugs policy, also in the toilets at main events. Communication is always accessible between each bar and entrance with staff and security via walkie-talkie'.

# c) Public Safety

'Every event organiser will provide a risk assessment per event and attend an on-site meeting with ourselves, the Police, Fire Service, Council, Environmental Health if required (including Ambulance Service). Also even if stated for advertising purposes maximum number of people will not exceed 2000 at any one time. Security levels will meet legal requirements at all times and we will only use legitimate companies who have followed all health and safety terms'.

# d) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

'Within a half mile radius we will ensure a sound engineer will be working all day and limiting sound so it will not effect any residents. From a previous meeting with the Police and the Council we provided a satisfactory event plan and ensure personally that contact between us and any other person will be available for any discussions or concerns before, after and on the date of any event. All music levels will be set much below legal requirements we will be employing an experienced sound company for all events'.

# e) The Protection of Children from Harm

'Strict proof of identity for age 18 for entrance to large events. General bar sales, every day functions and events – operate Challenge 21 Policy'.

# 4 Responsible Authorities

- 4.1 On the 14 April 2011, Licensing Officer Miss Kirsty Green, on behalf of South Yorkshire Police, submitted a representation as a Responsible Authority under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, opposing the grant of the licence on the grounds of crime and disorder, as set out in Appendix 2.
- 4.2 Furthermore, comments have also been sought from the Pollution Control Section of Regulatory Services who raised initial concerns regarding the proposal to undertake a number of external activities until 02.00 seven days a week.
- 4.3 With this in mind, Senior Pollution Control Officer, Mr Stephen Billcliffe contacted Mr Brendan West early in the application process with a view to

working closely together in agreeing a robust noise management plan and in doing so, mitigating any potential noise issues from arising in the future.

4.4 Site visits to the premise have been undertaken where a noise management plan has been devised and agreed. Subject to the decision made by panel members today, Mr Billcliffe has further recommended the noise management plan be conditioned to the revised licence.

A copy of the agreed noise management plan is attached as Appendix 3.

#### 5 Interested Parties

- 5.1 Following publication of the statutory notice of the premises licence application in the local press and the display of notices at the premises, a number of representations have been received from Interested Parties, including one in the form of a petition.
- 5.2 In total, nine representations have been received from both elected members and local residents who live and/or represent those who live within close proximity to the premises.
- 5.3 The representations have been received from:

N.B. Members are minded to note that a number of names listed on the petition have been discounted as the names supplied are illegible and therefore cannot be taken into consideration.

- 5.4 Valid representations which relate to one of more of the four licensing objectives are attached as Appendix 4.
- 5.5 Under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, representations can be made by Interested Parties who live, represent, or have any interest in a business that is located within the vicinity of where the premise licence application has been made. In this case interested parties concerned either reside or represent those who reside within close proximity of where the premise application has been made.
- 5.6 Each representation sets out a number of areas of concern in relation to the licensing objectives and a précis of these are given below:
  - a) 'Appalled at the prospect of residents being subject to further noise nuisance and being unable to sleep at a reasonable time at night'.
  - b) 'Another effect of events already being held is the noise from vehicles leaving the site at late at night and in the early hours'.
  - c) 'Seven days a week until 2am will bring about many problems with noise'.
  - d) 'Music until 2am seven days a week is totally irresponsible, thoughtless and unacceptable'.
  - e) 'Concern noise from both the premises during the events as well as people walking and driving past our properties'.
  - f) 'Music can be heard late at night from neighbouring properties. Music continues well into the night, passed a reasonable time when working people, parents and young children wish to go to bed on a week night'.

N.B Members are minded to note that issues raised in respect of parking, traffic, car boot sales and security of properties do not relate to the four licensing objectives and therefore have not been taken into consideration.

5.7 The applicant, Mr Brendan West has been in close contact with the Licensing Section throughout the application process and has indicated he is willing to work with all parties involved in order to seek resolution to the issues that have arisen.

# 6. Compatibility with the European Convention on Human Rights

The decision of the Board will amount to a determination of the Council and the rights of the applicant. Therefore, as far as it is possible to do so, the board must comply with the requirements of Article 6 (the right to a fair trial). This means the applicant and should be afforded the right to make oral representations at the meeting.

If Members determine to refuse the application, it is necessary for the reasons to be clearly stated.



Subject: Formal objection to premises licence application

#### Good morning.

I would like to make a formal objection to the application made by Brendan West to vary the premises licence at the Old Post Office on Huddersfield Road, Haigh, Barnsley to extend the licensable area.

After consultation with the local Safer Neighbourhood Team, there are major concerns following the outdoor event that was held in September 2010. This event is very similar to the events that are proposed by the licensee to be held at the premises 4-5 times per year.

The event in September 2010 was held under a temporary event notice and was objected to by South Yorkshire Police on grounds of crime and disorder. Subsequently this event was allowed to go ahead. Despite numerous assurances by the event organiser and licensee on a strict and zero tolerance approach to the misuse of drugs and alcohol, there were 4 individuals conveyed to the Barnsley District General Hospital Accident & Emergency department with drug induced issues.

This demonstrates that illegal substances were actively available throughout the event and that this problem was not managed effectively. South Yorkshire Police therefore hold major concerns that as independent organisers will again be employed to hold such events in the location, that they will not be managed effectively and we could see reoccurrences of the event In September 2010.

As a result of the 4 persons taken to hospital with drug induced issues, not only did it impact on the health service who stated that should they have received any further casualties from the event then they would have had to treat the incident as a 'major' event, due to it limiting both hospital and ambulance staff. The event also had a negative impact on both South and West Yorkshire Police, who had to deploy officers to the venue and carry out further investigations.

#### VARIATION OF LICENCE CONDITIONS THE OLD POST OFFICE HUDDERSFIELD ROAD HAIGH.

I refer to the above matter and would comment as follows.

During the summer of 2010 complaints were received by Regulatory Services from a number of residents of Woolley Grange, a housing development located across the M1 Motorway which Is actually within Wakefleld MDC. The problems were associated with loud music from a disco held on Tuesday evenings.

To prevent any such recurrence I would suggest the following conditions are attached to the licence.

No noise should be audible at the façade of the nearest noise sensitive premises.

All live, amplified music should be played through a noise limiting device located in an area which cannot be manually adjusted by any resident or visiting DJ.

For outside events, consideration should be given to the location and orientation of the speakers. I would recommend that any speakers located externally should be facing in a westerly direction ideally with a solid screen to the rear of the speakers and amplifiers. This measure should mitigate noise complaints from the residents of neighbouring premises.

Any outside event held from Sunday to Thursday should either cease by 23:30 or the event moved inside the premises before this time to protect the amenities of neighbouring premises.

I and CIIr Alice Cave and CIIr Sharon Howard, as Darton Weat Councillors wish to make representations against the proposed variation of the premises licence for the Old Post Office, 600 Huddersfield Rd, Haigh, 8arnsley, S75 4DE.

Firstly we are concerned that the guidance about publicising the proposal means that people not living in the immediate vicinity will not necessrily know about the proposal and hence have the opportunity to object, even though they will be subject to nuisance if approval is given. We are aware that residents in Kexborough and Woolley Grange already suffer noise nuisance from existing events at the site but they will not necessarily have heard about the new application. As Local Councillors for the area which includes Kexborough we are the ones to whom residents have complained initially when the noise from the site causes a nuisance.

Under the existing terms of the licence local and more distant residents already have noise nuisance from music until 11.30 pm even on weekdays which are normally working days for the majority of residents. Families with children are particularly disturbed by the noise which we feel is unacceptable. We are also told that even when the music is indoors it is easily heard by local residents. At this event young people meet with their cars at the Old Post Office, and compare tricks they can perform with their vehicles. This inevitably spills out onto the main Huddersfield Road (A637) passing our house, and it is common to hear cars racing up and down what is already a busy and dangerous road late into the evening. The noise at our property from this use of the road is a concern, especially as we have been advised 2000 people are expected to attend the events, if they are all leaving at 2am this will clearly cause noise disruption at our properties. If the same racing occurs after such an event as happens on a Sunday night, with the sheer volume of people who will be using the road it will only be a matter of time before there is a serious accident. People have also started parking outside our property so they don't have to pay the entrance fee into the event, we feel that there is a risk this could escalate and more and more people could park here and this is not acceptable.
