Consultations

40 questionnaires issued -
Issues identified: **security, vandalism, children playing games, livestock, sheds**

Community Event on site in October with consultation on purpose, layout, security issues – **RAIN RAIN RAIN RAIN**

Residents meetings at Cricket Club ----- Feeling of great disappointment with the poor turn out

Wondering whether to pull the plug

Jola and Amanda doubled and re-doubled efforts with door knocking and phone calls and got a handful signed up

Acknowledged that small numbers at first could build into more interest once the project was up and running

GROWING A GARDEN – Growing a Community



In and amongst all this in January 2016 we needed to nail down the costs much better

Finally estimate £15350 *Including the Access Road*

Berneslai provided £8000

Alliance provided £7350





Easter Holiday Community Event

A turning point

Better weather and over 100 people

4 beds laid and adopted in advance

Further 8 beds laid on the day and adopted

Moved a mountain of top soil
