

## Isolated and Vulnerable Older People

- Winter Register. This has been particularly useful with the recent extreme weather. 34 vulnerable, older people registered but the service was available for others on request. We have 20 Good Neighbour Volunteers spread out across the area ready to help people in their community and Age UK Barnsley staff contacted vulnerable individuals to make sure they were okay during the snow. We received a variety of calls for help. These were mainly for shopping for basics like milk and bread. One person was worried about using her heating because she was low in her prepayment meter and a volunteer went out to buy a top up card for her. Another person was feeling ill and a volunteer went out to her, made a GP appointment and took her to the appointment. Although a small project at present this is a particularly valuable and needed community service. We believe that it would grow year on year and it has already reached across Crane Moor, Thurlstone, Penistone, Hoylandswaine, Oxspring and Thurgoland.
- Sloppy Slippers. The service will be focusing less on Penistone itself this year and more on the surrounding areas. This will start as always with engaging with the communities themselves. A Ward Alliance Grant has been given to fund Sloppy Slippers Events to help address falls due to ill-fitting and inadequate indoor footwear. Events will cover both Sloppy Slippers and Eyes on the Ground and will be held across the area in community venues over the next few months:

## **Penistone Youth Project**

The project has provided many opportunities for volunteering in the local community.

There are a vast range of individual projects within this project; from the building and development of a pizza oven in the local community garden at the Penistone IKIC Centre, to the **Adopt a Bench project**. This provided a very special bench to remember those had given their lives so others could have a future; over 2000 Poppies were made from recycled pop bottles to create a beautiful meadow for Remembrance Day.

Challenge projects have taken place at Penistone IKIC, enabling young people to gain new skills from health, fitness & First Aid, to workshop skills including sculpture.

The project has worked with young people to create a high quality footpath and a woodland walk at Broad Ings woodland; the volunteers have also built a number of woodland workshops cabins allowing further work to take place. The Working Together project has attracted external funding allowing the project to achieve more goals within the budget.

The project has also had a number of Touch Down festivals for young people taking place at Penistone Market barn, promoting current issues for young people- Health, Careers, Work and Law.

## **Bumping Spaces**

What's been happening?

- Three people have been chosen to form the start of the independent community group.
- Links have been made with SYFAB and VAB to gain help with this.
- Tour de Yorkshire crafting has began again, we will be decorating the train station. Sophia has joined us from Penistone Line Partnership to help us.
- The Round Table have ring fenced £800 to be used by our group in partnership with Age UK.
- The group relationships really showed throughout the bad weather conditions. For example people shopped for each other, and the older members of the group. What was really heartening is that this happened not because people were asked but because they just supported people naturally. Showing they now really understand what peer support is.
- Links have been formed with the Penistone Community Alehouse Project. This project when it comes to fruition will offer space and funding to local community groups.



- A meeting has taken place with Library Services about how we can work with them in the future.
- The Community Lunch and Breakfast Club are continuing to grow, attracting an increasingly diverse group of people.
- People are increasingly taking on the responsibilty of cooking for the group, growing the Community Kitchen ethos.
- The underspend on the project has been established as £4645.34. A plan has been put forward that would mean the project could continue until the end of August using this underspend.
- The group has also looked at what works and what doesn't and the new budget is based on this. It shows a decrease in staffing hours due to this, and also the fact that some parts of group work are now self sufficient.
- The facilitator of the group has began to write up how the group works, especially in relation to the benefits of a community group working from a sheltered housing base.
- Contact has been made with Valleys transport so that the group can begin to use their transport.
- More new leaflets for all of the projects have been printed and distributed.

#### Plans for the next few months?

- Three people from our group will be presenting at the event "The People Focused Group...Our Stories" in Doncaster. This event will be attended by over 100 people.
- Our final Love Where You Live Event has been planned for April. This has been slightly delayed because of a number of factors. It will be a "Table Top" sale at Pendon House to support them to raise funds for projects, for example Twiggs are coming to help them with their garden and they will need funding for plants etc.
- A party has been planned at Pendon House for the Tour de Yorkshire.
- A number of people from the group will be doing some work to feedback to mental health services about the issues that affect them in Penistone.
- Another trip to the Paramount is being planned.
- The Tuesday morning group will be joining the "Chatty Cafe" scheme.

Since the last report we have had an open day in January this was a great opportunity to meet listeners and bring more interest and awareness to the project.

If we could take anything way to learn from the open day is to have the next one when the weather isn't as icy as I feel this may have put some people off making

journeys out and maybe we would have had even more interest if we had placed it on a weekend day.

We have started to gain more ground promoting local community groups, and we have had various groups into the studio speak from Penistone Ladies Choir to Woodhead Mountain Rescue, with many more to follow through later this month.

We have a couple of trainees working on their NCFE qualification at the moment and we have had a couple more expressions of interest to get involved with the project, which have been followed up and invited in for further discussion as to what they would like to get involved with and how we can help them.
