1. Health and safety legislation update

 New Ionising Radiations Regulations 2018 – no fundamental changes to the requirements of the Regulations however, a new requirement to register activities with the Health and Safety Executive by 5th February 2018.

The change applies to secondary schools and the use of radioactive sources in science – activities have been registered as required and the Council continues to follow guidance from the school science service CLEAPSS on the management and use of radioactive substances.
