## Planning to support your local area

## The Dearne Area



As part of the Council's approach to local area working arrangements, your Dearne Area Council (represented by the Councillors for Dearne North and Dearne South wards) has been considering the information we know about your area and has started to work on what the main priorities are for inclusion in a Dearne Area Plan. The plan, when we are happy that we have gained as wide a view as we can from local people, will be referred to when allocating resources and funding to the area.

This leaflet tells you about the priorities we have identified to date and explains a bit more about why we think these are the ones we need to be concentrating on at the moment. This is the first step in planning for your local area, and gives you the opportunity to be part of what happens where you live.

The priorities we have identified so far are based on what we know about your area. The information is drawn from what you might have told us and consultation by other organisations i.e. Big Local and Turning Point (22 locally trained researchers), as well as statistics such as the 2011 Census and other local information we collect within the Council. Some of this information is provided here for you to consider.

## The Priorities identified for the Dearne area

#### Improving the Economy

#### Why this is a priority

- Lack of opportunities for people to work locally
- High number of vacant commercial properties in the area
- High levels of long term unemployed compared to the rest of the borough of Barnsley

### **Young People**

#### Why this is a priority

- Identified lack of places for young people to go in the area
- Local research identified teenage anti-social behaviour and gangs as a problem
- Higher than average number of teenage pregnancies
- Higher than average number of young people not in education, employment or training

#### **Debt and Benefit Advice**

#### Why this is a priority

- Approximately one third of working families in the area have said they are struggling financially
- Identified in the local research exercise as a priority
- 7.8% of households contain no adults in employment with dependents, higher than borough 5.3% and national 4.2% averages
- 7.1% of households contain 1 person with a long term health problem or disability, higher than borough 5.4% and national 4.6% averages
- Under 16's Child Poverty across the area is much higher than the borough (24.9%) and the national (21.1%) average, in both Deane North (39.8%) and Dearne South (29.4%)

#### **Community Involvement**

#### Why this is a priority

- A number of different pots of funding have been awarded to the area for community groups to make a difference in their area. This funding will be lost if people don't get involved
- BMBC is committed to changing its relationship with the community giving them more say in shaping their neighbourhood
- Getting involved helps to not only make people feel proud of where they live, but also to feel good about themselves and others who live in their area

### **Skills and Learning for Work**

#### Why this is a priority

- 39.1% of population aged 16+ have no qualifications, 6.8% higher than the borough average and 16.6% higher than the national average
- 6% unemployed, worst in Dearne North (borough average 5.1%, national 4%)
- Identified in local research exercise as one of the top 7 priorities
- Only 10.6% of the population aged 16+ have a Level Four + (degree level) qualification, lower than England (27.4%) and Barnsley (17.4%) averages




# Top Seven Priorities Raised by Local People from the recent Consultation Exercise

# Some useful information about the Dearne area

The Dearne area sits in the east of the borough of Barnsley and is part of the Dearne Valley link, which brings Barnsley together with Doncaster to the north and Rotherham to the south. The area has seen a number of major physical changes over the last 10 years, including the development of both commercial and residential properties and new road schemes. The area covers 16 sq km with a population of 22,387.
