Welcome to the first edition of our Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) Newsletter. Each quarter, we will provide you with key information to keep you up to date about the future health and wellbeing needs of the local population and opportunities to get involved.

JSNA Development

The JSNA aims to provide a picture of the current and future health and wellbeing needs of the Barnsley population. The JSNA has been developed as a web-based tool and is an important resource for the wide range of organisations and groups which are working to improve the health and wellbeing of Barnsley people.

By taking this approach, the JSNA encourages thinking about the broad range of factors that impact on health at different stages of people's lives, and helps to promote a joined-up approach by the council, health services and voluntary sector partners.

JSNA work is continuing, with a quarterly newsletter, local health inequality profiling, and the addition of mandatory needs assessments as well as thematic 'deep dives' into specific areas.

To gain a fuller understanding of the community's health and wellbeing, the JSNA dedicated webpage is arranged into headings focusing on:-

- People and Place
- Starting Well and Developing Well
- Living Well and Working Well
- Ageing Well

The JSNA webpage should be regarded as a repository of health and wellbeing related intelligence available that all partners and the public can access. Work on this stage of the JSNA will continue and new supporting information will be added to the webpage as it becomes available.



Barnsley's Poverty Needs Assessment 2014

We are currently developing a Poverty Needs Assessment on behalf of the Barnsley Anti-Poverty Board to enhance our understanding of how many residents are affected by low income and poverty across the borough and why. This information will be used to inform the development of our strategy and joint action plan.

JSNA Future Development— Prioritisation Framework

Priority areas for the Joint Strategic Intelligence Group (JSIG) work programme will be determined using a prioritisation framework. The work programme will be agreed with all relevant partners with timescales aligned to the Health and Wellbeing Strategy refresh, BMBC Corporate Plan, Barnsley Clinical Commissioning Group commissioning strategies etc.

Profiles have been published on Barnsley Council's website as part of the online JSNA

HEALTH INEQUALITY PROFILES: A set of health inequality profiles for each of the 21 Electoral Wards and 6 Area Councils were published in December 2013. The profiles were produced in order to provide a picture of health and health need in each of Barnsley's electoral wards and area councils to support JSNA. They are intended to help local residents, organisations and partnerships to understand their communities, so that they can work to improve health and reduce health inequalities across Barnsley.

Each profile contains information on:

- Deprivation
- Life expectancy
- Main causes of death
- Risk factors contributing to death

A summary snapshot compares electoral ward and area council data with the Barnsley and England averages. The profiles will be updated on an annual basis.
