Cost of the project would involve food/printing of information/prizes at end of the session and certificates. DH asked how many schools would be involved. Open access provision only by YAT & PCSO's before team moved in. Cuts in funding & staffing meant fewer areas now covered with youth provision but concentrating on 'quality work'. Breakdown of numbers provided/activities such as 'Blind Tucker Test' very successful. SF & PH asked why team did not work from Burton Grange and who worked in the Lundwood area. Nadine covers Lundwood. Team supports with High Kick awards. DB explained that present vicar for Lundwood leaving and asked if others from church got involved? Team explained that this was a separate entity not just church related but all community. Dentist to attend next youth session & will also train staff. 3 young people went onto training and are now employed Handicraft & games encouraged not electronic. Last session 15 July with BBQ and celebration for young people. Nadine submitted a Ward Alliance funding application to PJ. PJ explained plan and filling the gaps. Monday 14th July – leaflet had to go to schools – difficult leaflet to produce. Activities start from 22nd July when schools finish. DH asked if PJ had template to work from and offered to support with production of leaflet. PH asked if Ward Alliance funding would be funding activities? PJ explained that Monk Bretton Ward Alliance had allocated £1,000 but others had allocated £2,500. Youth team activities in Cudworth during the summer reduced antisocial behaviour by 11% PJ to visit PH & SF to discuss Sport Active work with up to 45 kids activities will be split across all areas of the Ward. PJ met with Dmitri about proposed activities from Youth Association–due to other activities half the money to be used July & September & one off fun day if panel agreed spend. PH and others were concerned that summer holiday activities were not in proposal. MS questioned who had approved the £1k funding for Doorstep Street Games? Proposal had been discussed (as referred to in previous minutes) but unsure about commitment to funding. AM questioned venues PJ explained Lundwood and Monk Bretton – DB proposed that Redfearns sports field for Monk Bretton and PH suggested Lundwood football fields for Lundwood. Panel discussed the proposal and PJ gave details of a CAB + volunteer support and training in Royston cost £2030 over 12 mths – 1 session per week – project seeks to support 50 people. Romero proposal accepted but KR requested that for audit purposes it should be on WA funding proposal form. Venues suggested were St. Paul's and Methodist Church Monk Bretton. PJ explained a joint project by BPL and Ward Alliances in Roston/Cudworth and proposed partial funding from Monk Bretton WA. Called 'Community Activator' – would mean £2,500 matched by BPL £2,500 + £12k from other funding not yet applied for (possible Sport England) Simon from BPL unable to attend meeting to explain project.
