5. Matters Arising

6. Update from Royston Scrutiny Steering Group

Environment, Planters and Barrels, an audit of the planters and barrels would be made encouraging volunteers to maintain, the maintenance may also include the planting beds on Royston Lane. The group also agreed to include the Canal in the Environmental project.

7. Allotments, The chair welcomed Jason Farrar of Groundwork Dearne Valley who gave an overview of Groundwork's current role in the management of allotments. A breakdown of the 7 allotment sites in Royston together with the number of plots on each site the number on the waiting list for each site and the number of vacant plots. I Royston there is only one vacant site, this has not been let due to its size. There are a number of other plots in Royston which are not being cultivated and action with the plot holders is underway.

Graham Kyte had prepared a note on Allotments in Royston which was presented by Cllr Makinson.

It was agreed that an audit of the waiting list would be undertaken, true numbers waiting for an allotment and the enforcement action being undertaken.

It was also agreed to investigate possible new sites, the feasibility of transferring the asset to the local community.

8. Health Fayre, Cllr Makinson gave an update on the discussions with Gail Naylor of the Royston & Carlton Community Partnership on the support to deliver the Health Fayre/Feel good Event. It was agreed to contact local surgeries to promote the event. The area manager gave a breakdown of the indicated project costs of £1,300.00. Members agreed to support the project with a grant of £1,300.00 matching the partnerships budget with a maximum project budget of £2,500.00 with any underspend being returned to the ward alliance.

The Health Fayre would enhance the Feel good Event targeting a wider age group and including road safety information.
