1. Apologies for Absence, Martyn Guilcher, Rev Dr Matt Bullimore, and Stephen Croft.

2. Declarations of Interest

None declared.

3. Correspondence & Communications,

The chair reported that members of the alliance who were school governors or wished to become school governors. The Barnsley Association of School governors would be holding its AGM on the 16th May at Holy Trinity School with Baroness Estelle Morris (Former Education Secretary) as the key note speaker. A number of issues were raised; these are covered in project updates.

6. Project Updates

DIAL, flyers for the advice sessions were distributed widely in and around Royston and the first session was attended by two individuals, which the organisation were pleased with.

Allotments the secretary had previously distributed a project proposal put forward by Groundwork Dearne Valley who have already secured funding to deliver it. A site meeting was held with Groundwork running through their proposals and outlining the work they hoped to complete on the allotments at Robin Hood and Jubilee Gardens, a suggesting start date was after Easter.

Albert Shepherd VC Centre, the community development officer distributed photographs of the official opening which was attended by a large number of individuals, and organisations. The chair commented on the wide range of publicity that the event attracted. She also gave thanks to Graham Kyte who was the driving force behind the project and to Cllr Tim

Cheetham for his hard work in delivering a successful opening, which was attended by members of the Shepherd family and Albert Shepherds former regiment.

Royston Directory an update was not available. A request was made at the previous meeting for comments and observations of the draft, with some being received. It was agreed that the Community Development Officer would progress with the final draft being distributed for comment before preparation for publication.

Canal concerns were raised at the lack of action on the issue of dog fouling and litter along the canal, members were assured that this location would be highlighted as a 'Hot Spot', but to date no action has been seen. Members were informed that footpath stencils should be installed by the end of May. They were also informed that a number of fixed penalties have been issued. Other areas in Royston have been identified as 'Hot Spots' these include Warren Walk, Robin Lane, The Canal from Church Hill to Midland Road and some School Routes. It was agreed that Enforcement should be increased and added to the agenda at future meetings for updates.

Royston Park,

Band Stand, Barnsley Community Build have been approached to provide an estimate for the repairs required to the roof of the Band Stand.

Parking, an update was requested on the proposals to extend the parking available off Midland Road. Funding has been delayed but it should be released shortly.

Skate Park, the amount of glass and rubbish around the area was highlighted.

Volunteering Activities, volunteers are undertaking a number of activities within the local community.

Adopt a Planter Scheme, members agreed to write to the individuals adopting a planter thanking them for all their work. They also agreed to the provision of summer bedding and compost, and the removal / repair other planters, replacing with square planters where required. Councillor Makinson to progress.
