«Welcome

By the time this issue of City Life hits your doorstep, let's hope that Spring is well and truly with us, and that some warmer weather is on the way. So much is going on in Worcester over the next few months to tempt you out and about, and to attract many other newcomers to the city.

Following on from the success of the newly revamped Angel Place market, Worcester will see new 'Upmarket Sundays' taking place in the High Street from Easter onwards - full details on p.9. To mark the 800th anniversary of the signing of Magna Carta, a whole host of events are planned in the county in 2015 (p.19). This will be a great opportunity to reflect on the benefits which freedom and democracy have brought to our society - and to remember those who have fought hard throughout history to defend these values.

The City Council is, with partners, looking at new ways of raising the profile of our city. Last month we joined a lively debate on whether Worcester should bid to be City of Culture 2021 (p.18), and we are the first organisation in the city to pledge money towards the development of a potential bid. We are also supporting a number of major sporting events later in the year, including Steve Cram's hugely popular Worcester 10K and the European Wheelchair Basketball Championships (p.20 - 22).

All of these initiatives need to be carefully costed and planned for - and above all, our priority is to ensure residents continue to receive the quality services they want and expect. On p.13 you can find out more about the City Council's budget for 2015/16, and how your money is being spent in the year ahead.

Last, but certainly not least, I'm sure I don't need to remind you that there are local and general elections on Thursday 7 May! Now is the time to check if you are registered to vote (find out how on p.5) - if you're not, you have until Monday 20 April to do so! And if you want to stand as a candidate, your nomination papers need to be in on 9 April.

What will Worcester's new swimming pool look like?

An artist's impression of what the exterior of Worcester's swimming pool is likely to look like has been revealed, as work on the design and financing of the pool continues.

Worcester City Council has backed the building of a new eight-lane swimming pool, to be constructed as an extension to the existing Perdiswell Leisure Centre.

The pool is budgeted at £10.45m and is due to be completed in 2016. The pool will be funded through a combination of borrowing and grants from external sports bodies - and is expected to appoint a construction contractor in July 2015.

Eight lane ambition fulfilled

The new complex will host an eight-lane 25-metre main pool with seating for 250 spectators. Built to Amateur Swimming Association (ASA) and Sport England's standards, the main pool will be able to host regional competitions as well as being suitable for swimmers of all abilities, with a depth ranging from 1m to 2m.

The development will also include an 18m x 10m learner pool with a moveable floor to allow a variety of uses, including providing confidence water for toddlers.

It's very exciting to see this first design for the new pool. I'm sure people across the city will be as excited as I will be to see the final designs when they are ready in a few months. The new pool will appeal to our city's learners, families and dedicated swimmers alike and will also host national and regional competitions, turning Worcester into a top swimming destination.

Work is currently underway to finalise the design, apply for planning permission and recruit a leisure partner to operate the new facility and other sport and leisure centres - on the council's behalf.

The existing swimming pool at Sansome Walk will continue to operate until the new Perdiswell facility is completed.



Time to make sure you are registered to vote!

In order to vote in local and general elections on Thursday 7 May 2015, Worcester residents must have registered as an elector by Monday 20 April 2015.

Last year, big changes were introduced to the way the electoral roll is compiled. Now, everyone who is eligible to vote is responsible

for registering themselves, under a new national scheme called Individual Electoral Registration.

Registering to vote is easy - just go to www.gov.uk/register-to-vote or call Worcester City Council's electoral services team on 01905 722027. You will need to quote your birth date and national insurance number.

If you wish to apply for a postal vote rather than voting in person on election day, the City Council's election team must have received your application by 5.00pm on Tuesday 21 April 2015. If you want to apply for a 'proxy' vote, which allows someone else to vote on your behalf in very specific circumstances, the deadline to receive applications is 5.00pm on Tuesday 28 April 2015.

If you've recently moved to Worcester, or have changed address since you last voted, now is the time to act and make sure that you're registered to vote in this year's elections. Your vote matters, so make sure you don't lose it!


Worcester City Council finds new home

Many staff at the City Council moved to a new office 'home' last month, following the recent sale of its administrative offices at Orchard House in Farrier Street to the University of Worcester.

The University also bought two neighbouring buildings, Wyatt House and Graveney House, in a deal worth £2.9m.

Most Orchard House based staff have now moved to the old library space on the ground floor of the Worcester Museum and Art Gallery, in Foregate Street.

Councillor Chris Mitchell, Worcester City Council Cabinet member for Value for Money, said: "This is excellent news for city residents, as the sale has produced a substantial capital receipt for the good of the city.



"It also means we can make better use of the properties we own, as we find an efficient way to utilise the old library space."

The council's customer service contact centre will continue to be based at The Hive and is not affected by this change in office.

A message from the **City Leader**

Dear resident.

Spring is in the air - the gloomy days of winter, when it's dark when you leave for work and return, are nearly behind us and thoughts are turning to the tasks that need to be done in the garden, the Easter break that is just a few weeks away - or that festival or holiday that you know you really need to book.

At the City Council, there is a renewed sense of optimism too with the approval of a new ambitious five year Corporate Plan entitled "Proud of our past, focused on our future" - which sets out five themes for the City and how the Council will operate in the future to support these aims. You can read more about the plan on page 13.

The vision for the City was agreed alongside a revised Financial Plan which provides a balanced budget for the next three years, putting the Council on a sound financial footing. This is being achieved by focusing on ensuring we are getting better value for your money by setting the outcomes we want to achieve and then sourcing the best organisations to deliver them. We will work with other public, private and voluntary bodies to deliver our aspirations for the benefit of the whole of Worcester, rather than trying to do everything ourselves.

This approach has enabled us to set a budget for the next year that freezes our element of your overall Council Tax bill, continues with the cuts to car parking charges and reinvests more money in keeping the streets clean, providing adequate litter & dog bins and improving play areas.

The budget also delivers a host of other new investments - such as £100,000 to support more events in the City, £20,000 to replace worn street name plates and £25,000 to keep the popular riverside corridor in good condition. It ensures no community is left behind by investing in the areas of highest need, paying the Living Wage and continuing the Welfare Assistance Scheme. £1.2 million is allocated to build new affordable housing.

This budget also provides the financial framework for the new £10.5 million competition standard eight-lane swimming pool and sports complex at Perdiswell. I'm committed to ensuring that the subsidy we provide to deliver the swimming pool that Worcester deserves is no higher than what we already pay for the current pool at Sansome Walk. This fantastic new facility will add to our growing reputation as a vibrant "Sporting City".

In the next year, we will contribute £500,000 to schemes to enhance the quality of the public space in the City Centre - such as repaving Broad Street and The Shambles - and further improvements to the Riverside. Up to £200,000 has been allocated for new public toilets in Gheluvelt Park to better meet the needs of families using the splash pad. The Council is also putting aside £200,000 to make the most of our history & heritage by enhancing The Commandery museum.

Finally, it's great to see the long term economic plan we have in this County is working, with Worcestershire being confirmed as having the third highest economic growth in England. That's right, after London and Oxfordshire, our area is growing the fastest and has benefited from major reductions in unemployment. Worcester has a prosperous future, and I hope the plans outlined assure you we are determined to make it an even better place.

Going Upmarket



Worcester's Angel Place market has undergone a major revamp, following a £555,000 investment by Worcester City Council, Worcestershire County Council and the Crown Estate. After a temporary closure while the work got underway, the market re-launched in early December - just in time for the busy Christmas period.



When does the Angel Place market operate?

Currently every Monday, Wednesday and Saturday.

What do the traders say?

Mike Price runs Respoke Designs, which makes jewellery from bicycle spokes sourced from local shops. He has been running the business for about 12 months, and has had a stall at the Angel Place market for two months.

"There's been a really positive response from local people; they love the mixture of crafts and other products," he says. "People say how friendly the market is, and that it looks nice."

Pat, who owns Worcester Luggage, has had a stall at the Angel Place market for about ten years, and also runs Vida Handbags, a shop in the Shambles.

"The new Angel Place market is about ten times better than it used to be," he says. "It is run professionally, and the people that run it look after the market properly. There are more stalls now - and more people coming to browse."

From Easter Sunday (5 April), a new market will be held every Sunday from 10.00am to 4.00pm on the Worcester High Street, between the Elgar Statue and the Guildhall. You'll be able to shop for arts, crafts, antiques, vintage items, hot food, jams, chutneys, and much more! Be entertained by buskers and street performers while you browse.



Balancing the books - and increasing your prosperity

Plans for a new focus on Worcester's future and a balanced budget have now been approved by the City Council. The £10.1 million budget for 2015/16 will:

- · Freeze the City Council's element of Council Tax bills and maintain current levels of parking charges
- · Reinvest in some of the areas that are important to Worcester's residents - £80,000 will be put back into street cleaning and £15,000 back into play areas



- Invest £25,000 in riverside maintenance
- · Re-direct one-third of the New Homes Bonus money the council receives from the Government - amounting to just over £0.5m - into residents' services
- · Use the other two-thirds for improvements to the city, supporting regeneration, infrastructure and the economy £6.6m expected to be invested over the next five years.

A series of budget amendments have also been agreed, seeing an additional £87,000 invested in a range of initiatives for 2015/16. These include the development of a potential City of Culture bid and a tourism business strategy, plus support for sustainable energy initiatives.

This budget aims to balance the books over the next three years, while freezing taxes and investing in services. It's an ambitious agenda for the city that we've set out in this new corporate plan.



Making Worcester safe

for vulnerable residents

A new scheme which aims to help vulnerable people feel confident and safe while out and about has launched in Worcester.

The national Safe Place initiative gives the elderly and people with a disability, illness or learning difficulty, or who just feel in danger, a range of safe places where they can go to for help if they feel they are being bullied, abused or harassed while out

Worcester's Co-operative stores have already signed up to the scheme and it is hoped that more retailers and cafes will now come forward.

Safe Place venues display the national Safe Place logo in a window or other prominent place. Staff there will be ready to help and assist anyone who goes to them for help, creating a temporary safe haven for them, whatever the circumstance.

Safe Place cards can also be carried by individuals, with useful contact details for family members or carers, which can be presented to staff inside a Safe Place.

The Safe Place scheme has already launched in Kidderminster. Here's how some individuals have benefitted:

- A 32 year old male with moderate learning disabilities was walking from the Town Hall to Cafe Nero and tripped and fell in the street. Very upset, the fall caused him to break his mobile phone, and he hurt his arm and side. He went to and received help in Café Nero, an identified Safe Place, and staff contacted his mother.

- An elderly lady in her 70s fell over in the town, grazing her knee, elbow and breaking her glasses. She was very shaken by the incident. She sought help at a Safe Place where she was able to sit down and have her grazes cleaned, while a relative was called to pick her up.
- A 22 year old female with learning disabilities was walking past Kidderminster Library and approached by two females asking for money. The female sought help at a Safe Place - Carters Bar.

More help for homeless people

Worcestershire has been awarded £242,968 over two years following a successful bid to the Government's Help for Single Homeless Fund.

The funding will be used to explore and break the route into rough sleeping across the county, and in particular focus on preventing homelessness arising from hospital and prison discharges.

Worcestershire's six local authorities will be working closely with public health, probation services and the voluntary sector to achieve this goal.

"We really want to improve the quality and consistency of service for single homeless people across the county and this funding will enable us to do this in a joined up way," says Cllr David Wilkinson, Cabinet Member for Safer and Stronger Communities at the City Council.

At the time of going to press, over 50 plots were vacant at a number of locations in Worcester. Renting a plot is very affordable. A full plot (one sixteenth of an acre) costs just £58 a year, and a half a plot, which is an ideal size for weekend gardeners, costs just £29 a

Dawn Morris has looked after an allotment at Pitchcroft since 2011.

"I first decided to hire an allotment so I could grow my own vegetables, take them home and cook and eat them," she says.

"You don't need to be an expert gardener to enjoy having an allotment. I love just being outdoors; you can enjoy the quiet and observe wildlife such as foxes and birds. I love it, and would recommend it to anybody."

"Where this is not the case, we will always strive to provide best value for allotment tenants through our work with the allotment forum, made up of volunteer allotment site representatives."





Vibrant workshop for possible City of Culture bid

Last month a workshop was held to consider what it would take for Worcester and the surrounding area to bid for City of Culture 2021.

Led by the Department for Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS), this programme uses culture and creativity to transform communities and help grow artistic talent. A City of Culture is designated every four years.

Following the first award to Liverpool, Derry-Londonderry (2013) and Hull (2017) have also been awarded City of Culture status.

Our local workshop, organised jointly by Worcestershire Local Enterprise Partnership, Worcester City Council and Worcestershire County Council, attracted more than 75 representatives from businesses, local authorities, sporting clubs, arts, cultural and other partner organisations.

The event at Worcester Racecourse, which was open to all stakeholders, sought to bring as many interested parties as possible together to explore:

- · The process to make a City of Culture bid
- · Who would need to be involved
- · What a local bid could look like
- · Resources required, financial costs and benefits
- · The feasibility of a potential bid.

The City of Culture debate was positive and very engaging. There was real enthusiasm for, and belief in, the strength of Worcester's offering - from arts organisations, businesses and public bodies alike. We now need to stand back and analyse all the feedback received.

All of the feedback from the workshop will now be collated and considered by the three organisations to understand what the next steps should be.

WORCESTERSHIRE Pome of Liverty and Democracy

2015 marks the 800th anniversary of the sealing of Magna Carta by King John – significant because for the first time, it gave the rule of law precedence over the rule of the monarch. The foundations were laid for liberty and human rights; England and Great Britain were on the road to democracy.

Worcestershire holds a unique place on that road. Throughout history, it has been a stopping point on the journey towards the constitutional democracy we enjoy today. The county is, in many ways, the home of Liberty and Democracy.

By the time he sealed Magna Carta in June 1215, King John had already formed a special relationship with Worcester and the surrounding county. He often visited Worcester Cathedral to worship at the shrine of Saint Wulfstan. His favourite hunting grounds were nearby in forests at Wyre, Feckenham and The Chase.

But his relationship with the county was destined to be bittersweet. As civil war brewed and the King was forced to concede many of his powers under Magna Carta, Worcester declared for the rebellious barons. Worcester: the final resting place

In July 1216, the King's forces recaptured the city, but the monarch's days were numbered. He died in October that year, specifying in his will that he be buried in Worcester Cathedral.


The great tomb we can still see there today is surmounted by the oldest royal effigy in England. It is a masterpiece of early thirteenth-century sculpture and is said to be in his likeness. It gives Worcestershire a direct link to the story of Magna Carta - and to the story of Liberty and Democracy - that is genuinely unique.





The first preparation work on the multi-million pound Cathedral Square retail and leisure scheme is now underway.

A radar survey of the roundabout has searched for signs of archaeological remains on the site, and two trees have been removed to prepare for future excavation work. Replacement trees will be planted as part of the completed scheme next year.

A full archaeological excavation of the traffic island is now underway, and is estimated to last until early May.

During this time, a small section of one of the traffic lanes will be closed off.

Have your say on new infrastructure and affordable housing

Three new consultations on planning documents supporting the South Worcestershire Development Plan (SWDP) are underway.

The funding of new infrastructure – from roads and schools to village greens – and guidance on where and how affordable housing is built are under the spotlight.

You can make your views known at www.swdevelopmentplan.org. The consultations conclude on 30 March 2015.

These consultations complement work on the SWDP, which is being jointly developed by the councils for Malvern Hills, Worcester City and Wychavon. The Plan will provide a long term vision up to 2030 for south Worcestershire, with the emphasis on boosting the local economy and delivering sustainable housing development.

The consultations concern the Community Infrastructure Levy that will be applied to developers who gain planning permission for new housing and large scale retail development; guidance on the contributions developers will need to make towards local infrastructure; and guidance on the provision of affordable housing.

At the same time, the latest public hearings are taking place in the Examination of the Plan.

The next two sessions are:

- Commencing 14 April 2015 at the Sixways Stadium, considering development management policies (the detailed rules that future planning applications will be assessed against, covering, for example, the design of new developments, the proportion of affordable housing to be included in residential developments)
- Commencing 12 May 2015 at the Worcester University Arena in Hylton Road, focussing on proposed sites in the main towns and villages in south Worcestershire.

New College students take over Worcester's sporting scene

Three students from New College Worcester, a school for blind or partially sighted young people, recently scrutinised the city's disability sport provision and made recommendations to councillors.

The students, who were aged between 16 and 18, visited the City Council on National Takeover Day – an annual initiative which gives children and young people the chance to work with adults for the day and be involved in decision-making.

After a quick pep talk from Corporate Director Ruth Mullen, the students interviewed representatives from Worcester's Boccia Club and the Old Elizabethans Cricket Club to get some insight in to what sporting opportunities are on offer for people with disabilities in the city.

Then they paid a visit to Worcester Snoezelen, an independent charity specifically set up to offer multi-sensory and creative activities for people who have a diverse range of needs.

In the afternoon, the students gave a short presentation to City Council Cabinet members, based on their findings and own personal experiences.

Making a difference where it's most needed

Community groups from Warndon and Rainbow Hill came together in February to celebrate the difference that Community Development Foundation funding has made to the lives of local residents.

"The Community First programme has helped residents in some of Worcester's most deprived areas," explains Francesca Davies, Project Co-ordinator at Worcester City Council.

Applicants were able to apply for grants of up to £2,500 in any one year, with awards going to those that best met local people's priorities, decided by a panel of local residents and public representatives.

The Panel allocated £84,000 to over 60 projects, using more than 6,000 hours of volunteering.

- Blackpole and Fairmount Community Group, which organised a big clean up and revamp of the play area in Turners Close Park

- Worcester Volunteer Centre, which funded a worker to go out to schools, community centres, GPs, shops and parks to encourage more Warndon and Rainbow Hill residents to volunteer
- More play rangers trained to meet Ofsted standards, raising the quality and amount of play provision in Warndon and Rainbow Hill
- Launch of DAWN a support group for the victims of domestic violence
