Report of the Group Leader (Licensing) to the meeting of the Statutory Licensing Regulatory Board Sub Committee to be held on the 1 November 2013

### **LICENSING ACT 2003**

### APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE Polish Social Centre, Blackburn Lane, Barnsley

### 1 Background

- On 1 August 2013, an application under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 was received from Mr Geoffrey Kemp of 39 Pond Street, Barnsley and Mr Keith Cooke of 80 Winter Road, Pogmoor, Barnsley A copy of this application is attached as Appendix 1.
  - A copy of this application is attached as Appendix 1.
- 1.2 Members are requested to determine the application for a premises licence.
- 1.3 The premise currently operates under a Club Premises Certificate and is located within close proximity of a residential area.

### 2 Application for Premises Licence

2.1 The proposed application requests the licence takes effect as soon as possible and requests the following licensable activities and opening times:

#### a) Indoor Sporting Events

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 01.00

#### b) Live Music

Monday to Sunday 12.00 – 01.00 both indoors/outdoors



#### c) Recorded Music

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 01.00 both indoors/outdoors

#### d) Performance of Dance

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 01.00 indoors

### e) Anything of a Similar Description

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 01.00 indoors

#### f) Late Night Refreshment

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 01.00 indoors

### g) Supply of Alcohol

Monday to Sunday 12.00 – 01.00 both indoors/outdoors

#### h) Opening Times

Monday to Sunday 12.00 - 001.30 indoors

### 3 Promotion of Licensing Objectives

3.1 The applicant has set out the steps intended to be taken in order to promote the four licensing objectives, if the proposed premises licence is granted.

#### a) General – all four licensing objectives

The licensing objectives have been carefully considered in the light of the proposed application, taking into account the venue and the site location.

Details of any measures considered necessary to promote the licensing objectives are contained under the relevant objective below.

#### b) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

'Check valid ID in the case of potential under age drinking. Regular policing of premises by Committee members and bar staff to ensure appropriate behaviour. Prominent notices about rules, regulations and expected behaviour and age limits'.

#### c) Public Safety

'Public liability insurance. Fire certificate. Regular policing by Committee re: customer's behaviour'.

### d) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

'Notices outside building re: language and leaving premises quietly with respect to adjoining neighbours'.

#### e) The Protection of Children from Harm

'Notice stating that children must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times. This is to be policed by Committee Members and bar staff. Checking age of customers if they look under 25 years of age'.

#### 4 Responsible Authorities

- 4.1 Whilst formal representations have not been received from Responsible Authorities involved in this process, it is important to note that both the Pollution Section of Regulatory Service and South Yorkshire Police have recommended a number of conditions to be attached to the premise licence, subject to this being granted under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4.2 Senior Pollution Officer, Paul Denton, contacted the applicant and recommended the following, as set out in Appendix 2:
  - Live and recorded music to be played indoors only
  - All external doors and windows to be kept closed, except for ingress and egress from the premises while any recorded or live music is taking place at the premise
  - No drinks to be allowed outside after 22.00
  - Signs to be erected at each exit door, and at the premises boundary asking customers to leave the premises quietly and respect the neighbours

- A competent member of staff to make regular checks around the boundary
  of the premises, to establish if amplified music/speech from the premises
  can be heard, with the aim of ensuring that no noise can be heard beyond
  the premise boundary
- 4.3 Members are minded to note that the applicant has accepted all of the above recommendations, however, please note the agreed change from 22.00 to 23.00 for the consumption of drinks outside.
- 4.4 As previously stated, South Yorkshire Police Licensing Department has also recommended a number of conditions to be attached to the premise licence, as set out in Appendix 3:
  - Proof of age must be requested if staff suspects that the customer is under the age of 18 years
  - Challenge 21 or Challenge 25 rule, or similar should be applied
  - Documents deemed as acceptable must have a photograph and date of birth
  - If a customer cannot prove their age the sale must be refused
  - All refusals register to be kept
  - All refusals recorded including the date, time of refusal, product attempted to be purchased, physical description of customer and any other significant comments
  - Refusals register to be kept near to the till
  - Till prompts/refusal register to be retained and made available to authorised authorities upon request
  - Refusal register to be regularly checked by premises management to ensure accuracy and any staff training needs

4.5 Again, Members are minded to note that the applicant has accepted all of the above recommendations being conditioned to the premise licence, if granted.

#### 5 Interested Parties

- 5.1 Following publication of the statutory notice of the application for the premises licence in the local press and the display of notices at the premises, a number of representations have been received from interested parties. In total, 11 representations have been received.

- \*Please note that on 14 October 2013, J Bodford, 2 Brierfield Close withdrew their objection, as set out in Appendix 4.
- 5.3 Valid representations which relate to one of more of the four licensing objectives are attached as Appendix 5.
- 5.4 Under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, representations can be made by anyone whether or not they live or have a business interest

within the vicinity of the premises where the application has been made. However, in this case interested parties concerned do reside close to, if not within the immediate vicinity of where the application has been made.

- 5.5 Each representation sets out a number of areas for concern in relation to the licensing objectives and a précis these are provided overleaf:
  - a) Noise is already loud in a residential area
  - b) Building has little or no sound insulation and during indoor performances the music can still be heard very loudly
  - c) Having to turn television volume up just to hear over noise caused by premises
  - d) Having to keep windows closed in summer due to excessive noise levels making it uncomfortable to sleep
  - e) Large groups of customers standing outside drinking, shouting, smoking and rowdy/anti-social behaviour and have no consideration for others
  - f) Summer Lane has broken glass from bottles and glasses from the Polish Club
  - g) Sleeping is almost impossible and having a window open is a definite no

### 6 Compatibility with the European Convention on Human Rights

The decision of the Board will amount to a determination of the Council and the rights of the applicant. Therefore, as far as it is possible to do so, the board must comply with the requirements of Article 6 (the right to a fair trial). This means the applicant and should be afforded the right to make oral representations at the meeting.

If Members determine to refuse the application, it is necessary for the reasons to be clearly stated.

#### HI Mr Kemp,

I'm just in the process of processing your application for a new Premise license for The Polish Centre, Blackburn Lane, Barnsley.

As part of my checks I have to ensure that all the four licensing objectives are fully covered in the application. Although you have added a proof of age scheme under the section of Protection of Children from Harm there needs to be a mechanism for ensuring alcohol isn't served to underage people.

Therefore, Can I please ask that you take a look at the two additional condition listed below and confirm if you are happy for them to be added to your license.

#### Proof of Age -

A proof of age must be requested if staff suspects that the customer is under the age of 18 years. To assist staff, the 'Challenge 21' or 'Challenge 25' rule or similar should be applied. This means that if a customer appears to be under 21 / 25 years of age staff must ask them to prove of age. Documents acceptable as proof of age must have a photograph of the holder plus a date of birth, ie passport, driving licence or an ID card featuring the 'PASS' hologram. If the customer cannot prove they are old enough, the sale must be refused.

#### Refusals Register

when a refusal is made this must be recorded, using a written log book or till prompts. Written records should include the date and time of the refusal, the product the young person attempted to buy, a physical description of the customer and any other significant comments (for example if the incident was reported to the police; customer confrontation). The refusals register should be kept near the till. Till prompts/refusals registers should be retained made available to the authorities for inspection on request. Refusals records should be regularly checked by the premises management to ensure staff are completing them properly and to help management identify staff training needs.

I write with reference to the application for a new premises licence made by The Polish Social Centre Barnsley.

Firstly I would like to mention that I am currently corresponding with Mr Paul Denton (senior pollution officer) of Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council regarding the excessive noise volume currently coming from the above premises, I have been keeping a diary as instructed over the last month to record the noise and disturbances caused by The Polish Social Centre which was provided by Mr Denton.

The noise levels and disturbances which we have and are still currently experiencing caused by The Polish Social Centre, are in mine and my wife's opinion unacceptable. On evening when events and performances are taking please we find ourselves having to turn the television volume up just to hear it over the noised caused from these premises even when the windows are closed. Also we have a fifteen month old son who's bedroom is in the front of our property, he is usually a good sleeper and has a strict bedtime routine, which has taken some time to get him into, but on the evenings of events and performances it is becoming virtually impossible to settle him due to excessive noise volume caused by these premises. We have to constantly keep the windows of our home closed on these nights just to help deaden the sound. We have even purchased some rather expensive shutters for our son's bedroom window to also help against the noise, but yet the volume still disturbs he sleep. Throughout the summer months we have also had to keep the windows of our home closed which at time the heat has made very uncomfortable, to help with the heat we have had electric fans running to help cool the rooms particularly our sons. We have also had to put our son to bed in just a nappy due to the heat and lack of fresh air in he's room.

All of this could have helped or even prevented if the windows were open to help ade the circulation of fresh air throughout the house. Even on rare occasions when the music volume has been low we have still to keep the windows closed due to the smoking area being situated directly opposite the residential properties, with the volume of people that congregate in this area (sometimes as many as thirty plus at a time) the noise volume of talking, shouting and singing along with the smell of smoke comes into our home. Also on occasions when events and performances are taking place there is a burger van which pitches along side the smoking area which also creates smells and noise from its generator.

It's not just the music volume which causes problems from these premises, on evenings when events and performances are taking place customers are using the street rather than the car park to park and this makes it impossible for residents to park their own cars on the street in which they live. To add to this you then have the noise of people talking and slamming car doors late in the evening when they are leaving the event.

Currently performances and events have only been taking place on Friday evenings and on weekends which already a nuisance, so should The Polish Social Centre be granted a licence for the terms of which they have applied for, the current situation will only become worse. Therefore myself and my wife object to this application. We feel the current noise levels and disturbances need to be addressed before any new licences are granted. The building clearly has insufficient sound proofing if any to accommodate the events in which it holds due to the sound levels that can be heard even when they have the doors and windows of the premises closed.

It has recently been brought to my attention that the Polish Social Club on Blackburn Lane has applied for an extension to their existing alcohol and live music licence to open until 1.00 am, 7 days a week.

This is totally unacceptable to the residents of Blackburn Lane. I live straight opposite the Polish Social Club and I have no idea what their current licence for closing time is supposed to be, but I can tell you that I cannot even contemplate going to bed to try and sleep much before 1.00 am as it is. People are standing outside drinking, smoking and generally being rowdy and making anti-social noise until well after midnight. They show zero respect for any of the residents of Blackburn Lane. This is not the Town Centre. The doors and windows of the Polish Club are often open, and even when they are not, the noise levels of the live music is totally inappropriate and unacceptable for a residential area. It sounds as though the musicians are in the street, not inside a stone building. They cannot have any sound proofing in the building whatsoever.

When I find myself having to turn up the volume on my TV all the time as I cannot hear it because of the very loud music coming from the Polish Club across the road, you will realise that the volume is far too loud. My lounge faces the Polish Club and I have no alternative but to turn up the sound to be able to hear the TV. I have double glazing as well, but it makes no difference. I have no objections to people having a good time, just not that late at night and not so loudly. I have lived in Blackburn Lane for over 55 years and have never experienced the current level of noise that has been present these last few years.

My telephone is also situated in my lounge and at times I have had to ring people back at a quieter time the next day as I have not been able to hear what they are saying. Surely you can see that this is totally unacceptable.

You need to remember that this is a residential area where people have to live and deserve some peace and quiet, especially at night when you are trying to sleep. I don't think that every weekend should be ruined by the constant noise, well into the early hours.

I think you need to make an unannounced visit yourselves to witness the noise levels and what it is really like to live here, especially at the weekends.

If I wanted to sell my house, I would have no chance of doing so if prospective buyers came to see the house at a time when the Polish Club was open and in full swing.

I am TOTALLY AGAINST the proposal to extend the current licence. This would mean that people would be leaving the venue at 2 and 3 in the morning. In fact, I wish the current licence could be withdrawn for live music as it is unbearable and unfair to expect residents, especially the ones who live close to the Polish Club, to have to endure the unacceptable noise levels every weekend.

Actually we object to the current hours but that is another story.

As far as I know noone in the street was aware of this application. Regardless of any "legal responsibilities" surely for the sake of good relations it is good practice to make sure people are aware of the application rather than trying to slip it under the radar. I am sure if you were looking for agreement for something you would have made a much

greater effort to inform the neighbours.

I am writing to you to voice my objection to the proposed alteration to the licence at the Polish Community Centre, Blackburn lane.

As a local resident I must stress how disruptive and anti social the current situation is, to extend these hours of licensing and entertainment even further would be appalling.

The building has little or no sound insulation, and during indoor performances the music can still be heard very loudly outside and in my own house across the street. Sleeping is almost impossible and having a window open at right is a definite no.

The people that gather outside to smoke/socialise have no consideration that it is a residential area and do not consider the volume at which they speak (or the colourful language they use).

Delivery wagons arrive from 5.30am to drop, literally drop metal casks of ale off, and people using the car park for various reasons see no harm in revving engines at absurd times of the night.

The view that the polish club is a members only establishment and non members have to sign in is not the practice that occurs. Anyone can come and go as they please.

I would in fact object to any license after 9 or 10 pm at these premises if that was an option. I am writing to you in relation to the proposed changes to the extension of alcohol and live music license until 1am, seven days a week at the Polish Club that is situated on Blackburn Lane in Barnsley.

I have lived on Blackburn lane for the past thirty one years and I feel that the current noise from the Polish Club is not acceptable however to extend this further would in my opinion have a detrimental impact upon this residential street.

The current noise levels from bands and revellers are very loud from the club itself and this often spills outside the Polish club and at turning-out time onto Blackburn lane itself. Adding additional hours for the consumption of alcohol and music will further increase the noise and disruption within this street.

Summer Lane has broken glass from bottles and glasses from the Polish club which could injure someone and puncture vehicles tyres. There is a school that is adjacent to Blackburn Lane and Summer Lane and with this amount of litter and broken glass this is an accident waiting to happen. If the opening hours are increased then likewise so will be the litter, risk of injury and damage to vehicles. This could result in potential action being taken against the Polish club and Barnsley Council for not maintaining a safe environment to pedestrians and vehicles.

Blackburn lane becomes very full with cars and individuals especially over the weekend and I do not want this happening seven days a week for the reasons stated above.

I am writing to you in relation to the proposed changes to the extension of alcohol and live music license until 1am, seven days a week at the Polish Club that is situated on Blackburn Lane in Barnsley.

I have lived on Blackburn lane for the past thirty one years and I feel that the current noise from the Pollsh Club is not acceptable however to extend this further would in my opinion have a detrimental impact upon this residential street.

The current noise levels from bands and revellers are very loud from the club itself and this often spills outside the Polish club and at turning-out time onto Blackburn lane itself. Adding additional hours for the consumption of alcohol and music will further increase the noise and disruption within this street.

Summer Lane has broken glass from bottles and glasses from the Pollsh club which could injure someone and puncture vehicles tyres. There is a school that is adjacent to Blackburn Lane and Summer Lane and with this amount of litter and broken glass this is an accident waiting to happen. If the opening hours are increased then likewise so will be the litter, risk of injury and damage to vehicles. This could result in potential action being taken against the Polish club and Barnsley Council for not maintaining a safe environment to pedestrians and vehicles.
