Report of the Principal Officer (Licensing) to the meeting of the Statutory Licensing Regulatory Board Sub Committee to be held on the 13th October 2009

LICENSING ACT 2003

APPLICATION FOR VARIATION TO THE PREMISES LICENCE The New Inn, Redbrook Road, Barnsley

1. Background

- 1.1 On 20th August 2009, an application under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 was received from The New Inn, Redbrook Road, Barnsley. A copy of this application is attached as Appendix 1.
- 1.2 Members are requested to determine the application for a variation to the existing premises licence.
- 1.3 The New Inn is situated on a main road which leads out of the town centre; it is situated in a predominantly residential area.

2 Application for Variation to the Premises Licence

2.1 The proposed variation application requests the licence to take effect as soon as possible and requests the following licensable activities and opening times:

a) Live Music

Monday to Sunday 10:00 - 02.00 both indoors and outdoors

b) Recorded Music

Monday to Sunday 10:00 - 02.00 both indoors and outdoors

c) Supply of Alcohol

Monday to Sunday 00:00 - 00:00 for consumption both on and off the premises (to permit the sale of alcohol 24 hours a day if and when required).

d) Opening Times

Monday to Sunday 00:00 - 00:00 (as per the existing licence)

- 2.2 During the application process, discussions have taken place between the Licensing Sergeant Derek Barker, the DPS for the New Inn, Mr Danny Treanor and Mr Matthew Gaunt, the Business Relationships Manager for Punch Taverns. Mr Barker raised areas of concern in relation to the requests of the variation application and during the discussions and it was amicably agreed that the applicants would be willing and happy to introduce further measures to ease the concerns of the Police and local residents.
- 2.3 The following measures have been formally agreed in writing:-
 - Premises to be closed to business at 2am the following morning Monday to Saturday (Sunday to close at 1am the following morning)
 - Sale of alcohol to cease at 1:30am the following morning on Monday to Saturday (Sunday to cease at 12:30am the following morning)
 - Bank Holidays, Christmas Eve and New Years Eve to close as per Monday to Friday times.
 - Exterior Music to cease at 7:30pm everyday with the exception of low level background music within the patio/smoking area which will terminate at 10pm everyday.
 - Music inside the premises to cease when the sale of alcohol is terminated.
 - A closed door system is to operate whereby no new customers will be allowed into the premises after midnight. However, those already inside will be allowed to stay until the close of business that period.

• All exterior doors and windows to be kept closed whilst amplified music is being played.

A copy of this agreement is attached as Appendix 2.

3 Promotion of Licensing Objectives

3.1 The applicant has agreed to continue to promote the four licensing objectives, continuing with the measures stated in their original application for the premises licence.

4 **Responsible Authorities**

- 4.1 Two representations have been received, one from the Pollution Control Section of Regulatory Services and one from Sergeant Derek Barker of South Yorkshire Police, both as a Responsible Authorities under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. Copies of the representations are attached as Appendix 3.
- 4.2 The Pollution Control Section objected on the grounds of public nuisance.
- 4.3 The Licensing Sergeant has objected on the grounds of Public Nuisance, Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. However, following the discussions held between him and the applicant, Sergeant Barker has indicated that he may withdraw his representation if these minimum standards agreed are accepted by the board.
- 4.4 No other representations have been received from Responsible Authorities in this matter.

5 Interested Parties

- 5.4 As previously mentioned in this report, the applicants Punch Taverns have already agreed measures which they hope will ease concerns. A copy of the agreed measures has been forwarded to all Interested Parties for their consideration.
- 5.5 To date one Interested Party has withdrawn his representation based on the newly introduced and agreed measures.

6 Compatibility with the European Convention on Human Rights

The decision of the Board will amount to a determination of the Council and the rights of the applicant. Therefore, as far as it is possible to do so, the board must comply with the requirements of Article 6 (the write to a fair trial). This means the applicant and should be afforded the right to make oral representations at the meeting.

If Members determine to refuse the application, it is necessary for the reasons to be clearly stated.

Dear Sir/Madam.

I am writing to register my objection to the Licence application mentioned above for the New Inn Public House.

The New Inn is cited in a residential neighbourhood. There are a number of houses within a few meters of the Inn on all sides (some of these houses are a matter feet away). There is also a Hospice close by. The community is quiet and peaceful and this is maintained and valued by the residents in the area. It is a very pleasant place to live.

There is little call, if any, for twenty-four hour drinking or a public house playing music of any significance. Furthermore, this type of establishment is not in keeping with the local area.

The residents in the neighbourhood are of all ages from the very young to the elderly, but I would like to emphasise that there are a large number of children of primary school age (including my own 6 year old daughter) living in close proximity to the Inn. It goes without saying that music being played outside the Inn will cause unacceptable disturbance at any time of the day. However, music being played into the night, from either inside or outside the New Inn, will cause serious problems to the rest and sleep patterns of these children. This, I'm sure you will agree, would be totally unacceptable!

As a result of events in the early part of this summer I have increased concerns. On a number of occasions the New Inn has played music on Sunday afternoons. The volume was so loud that I was unable to hear the music I was playing in my own home. Similarly the music could be clearly heard at the Hospice, on the Wharfdale estate and on Gawber Road.

During another, not so peaceful, Sunday afternoon a neighbour who was at the New Inn was so concerned by the volume of the music that he asked the manager to turn it down,

stating that it would be disturbing the other local residents. The manager was uncooperative and did not respond to the request.

To conclude, I feel the nature of the licensing application may be suitable for a public house based within the town centre or away from a residential area. However, a licence of this nature is inappropriate for a residential area and would not serve the needs of this community. To grant this would be of significant detriment to the area and the well-being of people living in the neighbourhood.

Clearly, this application does not have the interests of our local community at heart. Instead it seeks to attract a wider clientele, in order to serve the profit margins of a large national company. I strongly request you reject this licensing application in the interest of maintaining the peaceful and pleasant environment we have worked so hard to establish and in which we wish to live.

RE: NOTICE OF OBJECTION TO VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENSE FOR NEW INN, REDBROOK ROAD, GAWBER

I am writing to put forward a formal objection to the application which Punch Taverns have submitted to you for the above premises. The application is for music to be played daily until 2230hrs outside and 0200hrs inside and extended opening hours selling alcohol 24 hours per day.

When I became aware of this I was extremely upset at the possibility of this licence being granted.

The New Inn is situated in a quiet residential area of Gawber, with the nearest residential properties being only a couple of yards away. This is not an appropriate location for what will effectively become a 'nightclub'. Premises of this sort should be located away from residential areas due to the noise, parking problems, litter and rowdy behaviour that comes hand in hand with them.

I have already experienced noise problems from this premise, especially on a Friday night when music levels are at an unsuitable level and can go on until midnight. Living only 100 yards from the New Inn I found myself having to already wear ear plugs to cancel out the noise so I am able to sleep. I, as well as my neighbours, have to work on a Saturday and do not have the opportunity to catch up on sleep which we have lost through the noise from the New Inn. I have made a complaint to Regulatory Services on this matter before. It is much worse in the summer when they prop open the doors and windows when it becomes too hot inside the pub as there is no

suitable air-conditioning. Allowing this to go ahead on the condition that they close all doors and windows will not work in practice and will not be adhered to.

There is also no attempt for the landlord and landlady, who I believe to be first time licensees and inexperienced in running a pub, to encourage their patrons to leave quietly and I am often disturbed by rowdy drunks, revving engines and often violent behaviour as patrons leave the pub between 11pm and midnight. As this is already causing me distress, I do not wish to have to live with this 7 days a week, 24 hours. I have a busy, often stressful, professional role, as does my partner, and I cannot afford for this pub to be allowed to disrupt my life and affect my health through stress and lack of sleep.

My partner has two young children, which he has two nights a week. Whilst they have been trying to sleep, shouting of obscenities and revving engines often disturbs them on a Thursday or Sunday evening. This kind of environment, which an extended licence will further exacerbate, is not suitable for young children. A new playground has been created on the field opposite the New Inn and has attracted children to play on the field from further a field. However, I have seen patrons of the New Inn using the playground as a drinking area after hours and smashed bottles and litter are often found on the new play area.

I have also witnessed a number of fights by patrons outside the New Inn which have led to the police having to be called. A 24 hour licence and late night music will further attract a younger crowd, from what used to be a quiet family pub and I anticipate that this violent behaviour will increase, which leads to concerns about vandalism and criminal damage of nearby residents properties and vehicles.

There is already limited parking on Redbrook Road and Woodview Lane for residents and being in close proximity of Barnsley hospital often makes this worse. I believe that allowing this license will attract further car parking problems in the area on what is a steep gradient hill. Crossing the road is difficult already without pedestrian's vision being obscured further by inappropriate parking from the patrons of the New Inn.

Another of my concerns is regarding the social make-up of this area. Directly opposite the New Inn and my immediate neighbours are an elderly couple. The elderly lady is housebound due to medical problems and is on an oxygen tank

constantly. Her quality of life will be detrimentally affected by allowing for the New Inn to become a late night music venue.

I do not feel it is suitable for anywhere to be allowed to play music outside in a residential area daily, whether it was until 6pm or in this case 10.30pm. I have a basic human right to be able to enjoy the quiet enjoyment of my home, to be able to sit and watch television, to be able to sleep, to be able to not worry about whether my car will be covered in urine and smashed glass bottles, to be able to go to work after a good nights sleep, relaxed and refreshed, to be able to not worry about foul language the children are subject to, to not have to call the police out when a fight breaks out, to be able to enjoy a quiet conversation over dinner......all these things will not be possible should this inappropriate application be allowed to go ahead and my home will become unliveable. I also believe that this would be a detrimental effect on house prices in the area.

When the Licensing Act was revised in 2005 the aims of this new legislation were to:-

- 1.) Reduce Crime and Disorder
- 2.) Encourage tourism
- 3.) Reduce alcohol abuse
- Encourage the self-sufficiency of local communities
- 5.) Reduce the burden of unnecessary regulation on business

And that this would be achieved by focusing on the four overarching Licensing Objectives, which are:-

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder
- 2. Public safety
- 3. The prevention of public nuisance
- 4. The protection of children from harm

Each of these overarching objectives will not be met by allowing the New Inn to change its opening hours and the times at which it can play music. Crime and disorder is already a problem and this will be likely to increase due to alcohol abuse causing emotions to run high, public safety will be endangered further by the increased amount of inappropriate parking, public nuisance in the form of noise pollution and litter will increase significantly and effectively a 'nightclub' will be created, attracting youths from out of the area, into what is currently a quiet residential area where both elderly and young children live. You wouldn't want a school, hospice, old folks home or nursery next to a venue which had a licence to serve alcohol 24 hours a day, so why allow it in a residential area.

The New Inn is not a tourist attraction and it having extended hours will not impact on Barnsley's economy whatsoever, the community is a quiet residential area and this application threatens to destroy the community cohesion that currently exists. This pub is no longer used by local residents since it changed ownership and people are coming from outside the area to drink here as it is becoming known as a 'party pub', something which is not wanted or needed in Gawber. The focus here needs not to be on reducing 'unnecessary regulation' on the owners of the New Inn but on the quality of life of the people who have to permanently live next to it.

Already I am feeling stressed and upset about their proposal and I beg you to base your decision based on the level of distress this will cause local residences and how badly our quality of life will be affected if this is allowed to go ahead.

I have lived in this village for 43 years and have only experienced problems a couple of times, one of which was when the same pub was opening 'after hours' and we had the issue of youths from outside turning the village into an area where drugs was easily accessible and the crime rate was up by people coming out of the pub early in the morning 'pinching' cars to get home in and causing numerous damage due to their intoxicated state, not mentioning the fact that no one could sleep because of the noise.

Villages have had to put up with music being played outside of the pub on a bank holiday (which I now understand is outside of their original license agreement) which as you can imagine is not good when you are at home all day and cannot even enjoy the tranquility of sitting in your own garden in a quiet village because of the music coming from yoiur 'local' public house or hear yourself think in your own house.

In the past they have put up a trailor in the car park allowing no cars to be able to park at the pub and so they park on the childrens playing field, making it impossible for the village children to enjoy their own local park area. Or people being able to park who live in the area or are visiting. (This happens most bank holidays and bonfire night).

That is the trouble with a small village - noise carries and music being played outside in a small village until 2230, not to mention the noise of people coming and going until 0200 in the morning when villages are trying to sleep and get up for work the next day, is as you can imagine, something that could very easily cause great trouble.
