LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATION TO REVIEW A PREMISES LICENCE CITRUS ROOMS, 6 EASTGATE, BARNSLEY, S70 2EX

1. Background

1.1 On the 15th July 2010, Fire Officer Kevin Logan, on behalf of the Chief Fire Officer Mark Smitherman of South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service, made an application as a Responsible Authority under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 for a review of the premises licence for Citrus Rooms, Eastgate, Barnsley.

A copy of this application is attached as Appendix 1.

- 1.2 Members are requested to determine the application to review the premises licence.
- 1.3 Citrus Rooms, formally known as the Student Union Bar, operates as a bar/nightclub venue and is centrally located within Barnsley Town Centre.

2. Existing Licence

- 2.1 The existing premises licence became effective, following a transitional variation application, on the 24th November 2005. A copy of the licence is attached as Appendix 2.
- 2.2 The premises licence is held by Citrus Trading Limited, 6B Eastgate, Barnsley and Stacey William Ryder is specified as the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) for the premises.
- 2.3 The licence includes the following licensable activities and opening times:
 - a) Live Music (indoors only)

Seven days a week from 10.00 until 05.00 (the following morning)

b) Recorded Music (indoors only)

Seven days a week 10.00 until 06.00 (the following morning)

c) Facility for Making Music (indoors only)

Seven days a week 10.00 until 06.00 (the following morning)

d) Facilities for Dancing (indoors only)

Seven days a week 10.00 until 06.00 (the following morning)

e) Late Night Refreshments (indoors only)

Seven days a week 23.00 until 05.00 (the following morning)

f) Sale of Alcohol (on the premises)

Seven days a week 10.00 until 06.00 (the following morning)

g) Opening Times

Seven days a week 09.00 until 07.00 (the following morning)

- 2.4 The current licence also contains the following embedded restrictions:
 - The maximum permitted number for the premises is: Ground Floor 300 & First Floor 60
 - The conditions from the previous Public Entertainment Licence for this premises remain in force as embedded restrictions & a copy of Barnsley Metropolitan Borough Council Standard Conditions are attached.

In addition the following non standard conditions also remain in force:

- The joint fire escape through back yard shall be kept free of debris at all material times;
- Doors & windows to be kept closed whilst entertainment is taking place, except for acces and egress;
- Under arrangements for preventing noise nuisance device to be provided for limitation of amplified sound (decibal limiter)
- Entertainment to take place inside the premises only.

3 The Application for a review of the Premises Licence

- On the 15th July 2010, Fire Officer Kevin Logan, on behalf of the Chief Fire Officer Mark Smitherman of South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service, made an application as a Responsible Authority under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 for a review of the premises licence. The application is made on the following grounds:
 - Public Safety

4 Responsible Authorities

- 4.1 Further comments have been received from Stephen Butler, Senior Environmental Health Officer (Health and Safety) in support of South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Services' application for review.
- 4.2 The full details and evidence relating to comments made are contained within Appendix 3 of this report.

5 Interested Parties

- 5.1 An interested party is defined as:
 - (a) a person living in the vicinity of the premises,
 - (b) a body representing persons who live in that vicinity,
 - (c) a person involved in a business in that vicinity,

- (d) a body representing persons involved in such businesses.
- (e) a member of the Licensing Authority
- With reference to 6.1 (d), a representation has been received from the Jed Nuttall, Company Secretary acting on behalf of Citrus Trading Limited. A copy of this representation along with supporting information is attached at Appendix 4.

6 Options available to Members

- 6.1 In determining this application for a review of the premises licence Section 52 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that the authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such steps mentioned below as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence;

7. Compatibility with the European Convention on Human Rights

The decision of the Board will amount to a determination of the Council and the rights of the applicant. Therefore, as far as it is possible to do so, the board must comply with the requirements of Article 6 (the write to a fair trial). This means the applicant and should be afforded the right to make oral representations at the meeting.

If Members determine to refuse the application, it is necessary for the reasons to be clearly stated.

SYFR carried out a fire safety audit on the Citrus Rooms on the 12/01/10. The Fire Safety at the Property had been neglected and deteriorated to a seriously poor standard. The Premises were then issued with an Enforcement Notice listing all work required to ensure the Fire Safety Standards. Details are available.

SYFR have been attempting to work with the Citrus Rooms and have extended the Enforcement Notice, twice. The Premises are still well below the acceptable standard required.

SYFR have no confidence in the management in charge of the premises and have begun action to prosecute.

Statements are available of all findings and action taken, by SYFR and SYPolice. (Which include Locked Fire Exits whilst Open to the Public, Faulty Fire Alarm and Emergency Lighting).

With regard to the above, I enclose the Premises Licence and Premises Licence Summary.

The premises licence became effective on 24th November 2005.

Under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 you may, in certain circumstances, have a right of appeal against some or all of the Licensing Authority's decisions made in respect to your application. Appeals should be made to the Magistrates' Court for the area in which the premises are situated, within twenty one days of receiving the premises licence.

If you need advice on the appeal procedure, you should contact the court, but please note court staff cannot give you legal advice. If you need legal advice, for example about the likely success of an appeal, you should contact a solicitor or a Citizens Advice Bureau immediately.

If you consider there is a mistake in the premises licence or the premises licence summary, the Licensing Authority will correct anything which it accepts as being a clerical mistake. If you believe there is such a clerical mistake, please contact us. This does not affect your right to appeal.

The premises licence will last indefinitely unless it is surrendered or revoked, but will lapse in the event of the death of the holder of the premises licence or upon the licence holder becoming mentally incapable or financially insolvent.

An annual fee is payable on the anniversary of the grant of the licence, unless the premises are a school or community building, e.g. village hall. We will send you a reminder for the payment of the annual fee and advise you of what sum is then payable. The fees are set by Government and may be subject to change.

Finally, there are specific provisions in section 57 of the Licensing Act 2003 concerning the requirements for keeping, displaying and producing the premises licence and premises licence summary whenever the premises are used for any licensable activity authorised by the licence. A brief summary of these requirements is set out below for your convenience:

Premises Licence

The holder of the premises licence must ensure that the premises licence (or a certified copy of it) is kept at the premises and is either in the custody or control of the holder of the premises licence or some other specific person who works at the premises (e.g. manager).

Premises Licence Summary

The holder of the premises licence must ensure that the premises licence summary (or a certified copy of it) is prominently displayed at the premises and, if the premises licence (or a certified copy of it) is in the custody of someone other than the holder of the premises licence, a notice must also be prominently displayed stating the position (e.g. manager) of that person.

Duty to Produce

A police constable or an authorised officer (e.g. a Council licensing officer) may require such person who has custody of the premises licence (i.e. the holder of the premises licence or such other nominated person, as referred to above) to produce the licence for examination.

Offences

The holder of a premises licence commits an offence if they fail to comply with the above requirements relating to a premises licence and / or a premises licences summary. Anyone who has custody or control of the premises licence (i.e. the holder of the premises licence or such other nominated person, as referred to above) commits an offence if they fail, without reasonable excuse, to produce the licence in accordance with a requirement under the above duty to produce. A person guilty of an offence under section 57 is liable on summary conviction to a fine.

Response to License Review re: The Citrus Rooms

Following the notification of the License Review called by the SYFRS attempts have been made to carry out a health and safety inspection with the new owner of the Citrus Rooms, Citrus Trading Limited, including two abortive meetings on site and two other appointments not kept. Access to the premises has not been granted and to date safety documents have not been made available.

At the first visit on 22 June 2010 an Action List (copy attached) was left identifying the most basic safety documents that should be made available, including risk assessments. To date none of these documents have been provided for inspection or comment and both managers over this period, Nick Selway and Stacy Rymer told Mr Butler that they were not aware of any of their existence or contents.

As such an assumption has been made that they probably do not exist and as such that The Citrus Rooms is not being operated to minimum health and safety standards.

A health and safety improvement notice has now been served along with a covering letter and guidance notes (copies attached) requiring the completion of risk assessments by 22 August 2010.

A summary of the attempts made to inspect premises and documentation is summarised below:

22 June 2010 Manager Nick Selway and Director Adrian Channer seen. Mr Selway is not aware of any risk assessments, safety documentation, or maintenance records and referred me to Adrian Channer. Mr Selway has received no specific H&S training and when questioned was clearly unaware of the legal minimum requirements.

Mr Channer intervened and informed me that the previous owners had not passed on any documentation. He told me that he is currently having the premises rewired. As a substantial part of the electrical system including most of the lights were inoperative an inspection was not possible. Mr Channer asked me to leave a list of information about what he needed to do. I wrote these down on an inspection report sheet. Mr Selway signed the inspection sheet while he attended to bailiffs who had apparently called unannounced.

6 July 2010 A callminder message left for Nick Selway requesting update on progress.

13 July 2010 An appointment made to meet Promotions Manager Stacey Rymer (as Mr Selway was in the process of leaving the company) and also Director of the company, Adrian Channer on Thurs 22 July 3pm. I spoke with both Mr Rymer and Mr Channer and informed them that I intend tol look at progress on the issues written on inspection report and to continue the physical inspection begun on 22 June.

22 July 2010 Visited The Citrus Rooms as appointed but no-one present. I took 4 photographs that show the shutter down and glasses left on the tiled step.

28 July 2010 I rang Adrian Channer. He claimed that he thought that I had met with Stacy Rymer. I told him that the premises were locked and shutters down - I asked how to contact people on site. He said that that is a problem. A new appointment was made for Mon 2 Aug at 11am when both men should be present.

2 August 2010 Visited as per appointment made with Adrian Channer. Stacy Rymer seen but he was waiting to see someone from the insurance company and was not expecting me.

Mr Rymer told me that Mr Channer was 'held up in Sheffield'. He was not aware of any H&S documentation, has not seen any and has not been told

about any by Mr Channer or trained in H&S.

Mr Rymer told me that he thinks that Mr Channer may be present this afternoon. I wrote on a piece of paper provided by Mr Rymer that I will visit this afternoon at 2pm and asked Mr Rymer to pass on to Mr Channer that will expect to see risk assessments and other safety documents.

- 2 August 2010 I visited at 2pm but premises locked and lights off. A note on the floor (presumably fallen off the door) for the 'insurance guy' asked to call Stacy on his mobile phone number. I rang this number but no reply, eventually tripped to answerphone. I rang again and left a message for Stacy asking for him or Mr Channer to ring me.
- 2 August 2010 I telephoned Adrian Channer. It rang out to a Vodaphone messaging service. I left a message asking Mr Channer to ring me asap as I am now considering serving an improvement notice.
- 3 August 2010 Spoke with Stacy Rymer on his mobile phone. I told him that I will be serving the notice by posting to both the Citrus Trading Limited registered office (address confirmed) and at the Citrus Rooms. He confirmed that there is a letter box to the right of the door.

 Mr Rymer rang back and asked me to email the list of certificates to him. I emailed my inspection report and a copy of the notice with its covering letter to Mssrs Rymer and Channer. The improvement notice was served by recorded delivery and also posted by hand into the letterbox at The Citrus Rooms.
- 6 August 2010 I visited Citrus Rooms for 12 noon appointment made with Mr Rymer at his convenience. The shutters were down and there was no sign of activity. At 12:20 I telephoned Mr Rymer who admitted to having forgotten. I suggested that he speak with Mr Channer and arranges another appointment with me asap. I took a photo of the lowered shutter.

No further communication has been received. Stephen Butler 9 August 2010

Application by South Yorkshire fire and rescue ("SYFR") to review the licence at the Citrus Rooms, 6 Eastgate Barnsley, S70 2EX ("the Premises").

I should be grateful if you would accept this letter as our formal response to the Application made by SYFR for the Council to review the licence at the Premises. Attached is a bundle of documents to which we shall refer. I am the Company Secretary of Citrus Trading Limited ("the Company") and am duly authorised to make this statement on its behalf. I will say as follows:-

Respondent

The Premises Certificate is held by Company whose registered office is at Union Forge, 39 Mowbray Street, Sheffield S3 8EN. Telephone: 0114 276 9090.

Background

I understand that the Premises were once the student union building and they were acquired by Mr Keiron Armstrong ("Mr Armstrong") in 2001. Mr Armstrong undertook a comprehensive scheme of remodelling of the Premises to include removing a large part of the first floor to create a large void. I am told by Mr Armstrong that at that time Planning Permission and Building Regulations were granted for the works for which a full 5-year NIC certificate for the electrical works and fire alarm were produced.

Mr Armstrong operated the Premises up until 1 December 2009 when a lease was granted to the Company. The Company acquired the staff from Mr Armstrong,

At the time Mr Armstrong made numerous representations regarding the running of the Premises and the documentation that was in place. The relevant ones for this matter were:-

1. That the Fire Officer had carried out a full and detailed inspection of the Premises in August 2009 (just 3 months prior to the grant of the lease) and the Fire Officer had indicated that the Premises were satisfactory. The Fire Officer gave no indication that anything required doing to the Premises.

 That the manager and staff were fully trained in issues of public safety, Health and Safety issues and management of the Premises.

Events in December 2009

The Premises operates on just 3 nights per week, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. As such, the Premises are not staffed full time.

On the morning of Friday 18 December 2009 the Mr Kevin Logan the Fire Officer called in at the Premises and spoke to Mr Stacey Rhymer, the manager who was at the Premises. Mr Logan carried out an inspection of the Premises and identified an area that he considered to require improved emergency lighting.

Mr Logan went on to insist that if the works were not carried out that day he would prevent the Premises opening that evening. The significance of the date is that for many it was the last working day before Christmas (commonly known as "Mad Friday"). Being forced to close that day would inevitably mean that the Premises would have been closed throughout the Christmas period.

The manager was unable to get hold of the director of the Company or I. He used his initiative and after several attempts was able to persuade an electrician to come and install an additional emergency light in the Premises to satisfy Mr Logan.

Mr Logan did not request any other works carrying out.

Inspection in January 2010.

Mr Logan visited the Premises again in January (I understand this was 12 January 2010). This was not an arranged appointment so no officer of the Company was present. Mr Logan met with Mr Rhymer and carried out a full inspection of the Premises.

Following this inspection the Fire Officer did not issue any documentation whatsoever. No list of the "items" was provided and it appears that the Fire Officer relied entirely on Mr Rhymer to recall what was said to him regarding any identified "defects".

I am informed by Mr Rhymer that his recollection of the inspection was that the Fire Officer had only made asked him to get a push bar on the rear doors and that some of the settees in the rear room made it cluttered.

The impression of Mr Rhymer from that inspection was that overall the Fire Officer did not have any undue concerns regarding the Premises.

If the Fire Officer had serious concerns then these should have been itemised and set out in writing. Not to do is unfair to the Company.

Enforcement Notice

Following the inspection of 12 January 2010 no real opportunity was given to carry out any works. The Fire Officer issued an Enforcement Notice on 20 January 2010 (Just 4 working days after the inspection).

The Fire Officer chose to invoke a Statutory Procedure rather than issue a list of items to be rectified and give the Company, as a recent new owner of the Premises, a reasonable opportunity to carry them out.

I was informed on 26 January 2010 that the Enforcement Notice had been served. I immediately contacted the SYFR and Mrs Elaine Etherington e-mailed me a copy of the enforcement notice on 27 January 2010.

The Notice was in legal format and from my reading of it I could not readily define the items that the Fire Officer considered required attention. I therefore contacted Mr Logan.

In the telephone conversation he started to go through a list of the items he had identified as a requiring attention. I made notes but I wanted to ensure that the Company had an "action list" of all items that required attention so that they could be dealt with methodically.

I also recall asking him why he had not provided a written list at the inspection. Mr Logan indicated that "he thought Stacey [Mr Rhymer] would remember". I indicated that perhaps this was unfair in that the Fire Officer had identified a long list of fairly minor items such as a "loose socket on wall" and if he had itemised all this to Mr Rhymer on the inspection it would have been a lot to remember.

I requested that the Fire Officer attend a meeting on site with me and the director. The aim of this meeting was that it would enable a comprehensive list to be created to ensure that every concern of the Fire Officer was addressed.

Inspection 25 February 2010

Mr Logan and his colleague, whose name I do not recall attended a meeting at the Premises on 25 February 2010 where a full inspection of the Premises was carried out.

I made notes of the points raised and discussed. Following the meeting I typed these notes up and forwarded them by e-mail and post and asked Mr-Logan to confirm that they covered all of the points that he required rectifying.

Attached to this statement at pages 1 to 3 of the schedule is a copy of the list I prepared together with my covering letter. This list is quite extensive having 31 separate items some of which were major items.

I would comment as follows:-

- All of the items on the list have been completed but the FO has not been to inspect the premises again. At pages 4 to 7 is a further copy of the list on which I have marked the action taken.
- Without exception ALL of the items identified as defects by the FO existed prior to the Company taking a lease of the Premises on 1 December 2009. The majority of these (eg 8.1 exposed timber and 4.1 Push bar) I am informed by Mr Armstrong have been in existence since the Premises were refurbished some 9 years ago!
- 3. The FO carried out a full inspection in August 2009 and made no comment about these alleged defects. I am informed that the FO has carried out annual inspections before that.

The FO has stressed two points on the list that he considers to be of the greatest importance;

- 1. Push bar on rear door (point 4.1) This door had never had a push bar on it for 9 years (9 annual inspections by the FO).
- 2. "5 year fixed wiring NIC test." This is a major exercise, hence only being required once every 5 years. I am informed by Mr Armstrong that the FO visited the Premises every year. On no occasion did he require the NIC test. This will have been due from 2006. The FO chose to overlook this on 4 annual visits.

At pages 8 to 19 of the schedule is a copy of the report of the 5 year fixed wiring NIC test:

I believe that the FO has continually failed in his duty over the last 9 years by not requiring the items now identified by him to be defects to be rectified on each of his annual visits. By representing to Mr Armstrong in August 2009 that all was well he has severely prejudiced the position of the Company.

Communications with Fire Service

At page 20is attached a copy of an e-mail I sent to the FO on 10 March 2010. In this I ask about the annual inspections and ask for copies of the report prepared of the August 2009 inspection.

The reason I ask for the "log" of the visit is that the FO has indicated to me that at the inspection in August 2009 a full inspection was not carried out all that happened was that a "log" was signed by the then operator of the premises (Mr Armstrong) confirming that all was in order.

Mr Armstrong has indicated that the FO carried out a full inspection, which to me is the more credible representation as it is the duty of the FO to inspect premises rather than rely on operators to self-certify.

I have not had a response to this e-mail.

At pages 21 to 23 is a copy of my letter of 19 April 2010 I have sent to the Chief Fire Officer complaining about the heavy-handed approach of Mr Logan.

At page 24 is a copy of my letter of 9 July 2010 again to the Chief Fire Officer chasing a response to my letter of complaint.

I am astounded not to have received a response to these letters.

Conclusion

I fall to see what SYFR are seeking to achieve by this Application save as a smokescreen to cover up the fact that they have been lax in their inspections.

The premises were not regarded as "defective" when a full inspection was carried out. The Company has paid a considerable amount of money to Mr Armstrong for the grant of a lease and the action of the SYFR will prejudice the viability of this business.

I refer to your visit to the premises this morning and now attach a list of items highlighted. I think this covers all of the points we discussed but would appreciate your comments on it.

As you are aware, since the service of the notice considerable steps have been taken by us to progress the issues. The electrician is yet to report but I expect this early next week with a view to them starting on upgrading the emergency lighting system immediately.

As we have discussed the company only took over the premises (1 December 2009) and I am shocked at the apparent enormity of the work that needs to be done. The vast majority of the points you have raised have been that way for a good number of years and are not recent occurrences.

Clearly someone from the previous ownership has misrepresented the state of affairs (as recently as August 2009) and your colleagues have taken those representations in good faith.

i am writing to ask for a short extension of time to allow all of the works to be completed to a satisfactory standard. I would ask for 14 days. Of course, in your inspection next week you will see that good progress will be made.

I am writing to you in respect of recent enforcement action your organisation has taken against this company in respect of the Premises.

The Premises are a night club. Historically, I understand that it was the Student Union building but it was acquired in around 2001 by Mr Keiron Armstrong and substantial works were carried out in altering the internal layout to its present format.

On 1 December 2009 our company took a lease of the Premises from Mr Armstrong. In negotiations with Mr Armstrong prior to taking the lease we were assured by him that all of the required permissions and certificates were in place and that the Fire Officer had inspected the Premises as recently as August 2009 (just 4 months prior) and passed them for their use.

It came as a huge surprise therefore to have the Fire Officer, Mr Kevin Logan come into the Premises on Friday 18 December 2009 (Being the Friday before Christmas) and insist that further emergency lighting be installed immediately failing which we would not be allowed to open.

Our manager reacted swiftly to this demand and was able to locate a local electrician who was prepared to carry out this job on the last working day before Christmas.

This inspection was followed by a further inspection by Mr Logan who set out an extensive list of works. Mr Logan did not produce a list of the items that he considered required doing (which I find somewhat strange) so I had to produce the list and send it to Mr Logan for him to confirm that the list encompassed the items that required doing.

A copy of my list of these works is attached. You will see that it is a long list of many items. I would point out that we have moved very quickly and the majority of the items have been done and we are making good progress on the main item which is a fixed 5 year wiring inspection and any necessary work that this inspection reveals.

- 2. Provide a copy of the "log" that was signed by the owners of the building in August 2009 when your colleague visited.

In respect of the 5-year test we have appointed an electrician who has inspected the wiring of the Premises and indicted that there is substantial work required to bring the wiring up to a standard on which they would be prepared to produce a certificate.

Turning now to what is the thrust of our complaint which is as follows:-

1. I am informed that the last time an electrical certificate was issued on the premises was 2001. This was after the completion of substantial remodelling works by Mr Armstrong. I assume Planning Permission and Building Regulations together with Fire Officer approval were required at that point. I am somewhat surprised that your organisations did not require sight of the 5 year test in 2006 nor in the 4 annual inspections that followed it.

I would appreciate your comments on this apparent lapse.

The items identified by Mr Logan have not occurred in the short period from 1 December 2009 (when this company took the lease). I would say that all of them are long-standing issues. In this regard I would point out items such as woodwork not plaster-boarded that has clearly not been covered since 2001.

It appears to me that there has been a continual failure on the part of your organisation in annual inspections which has allowed the individual issues to build up.

I would appreciate your comments in respect of this point. In particular in respect of the August 2009 inspection of which I am informed by Mr Armstrong that one of your officers, Kevin (I am not sure of his surname).

3. Heavy-handed approach; This company, only took over the lease on 1. December 2009. 17 days later Mr Logan was threatening to close the club if an emergency light was not fitted immediately that day.

The Enforcement notice was served within 7 weeks of that. I feel that the attitude of Mr Logan is that all of the issues are of our doing when clearly they have built up over many years and as a result of the failure on your point to monitor the situation over the past 9 years and perhaps a too-relaxed relationship with Mr Armstrong.

Again, I would appreciate your comments on this point.

To conclude, we are responsible operators and the safety of our customers is paramount. We have carried out the vast majority of the items identified and are endeavouring to resolve the remaining ones. That said, this is a new business and we had entered into the lease on representations that all was in

order and we had not budgeted for the considerable costs that we are now to incur as a result of your officers demands.

You must appreciate the commercial reality of this which is not helped by your officer threatening Court proceedings that would attract indicated fines of £20,000.00.

In the circumstances, I look forward to hearing from you in early course.
