Report of the Principal Officer (Licensing) to the meeting of the Statutory Licensing Regulatory Board Sub Committee to be held on the 20th April 2011

LICENSING ACT 2003

APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE Costcutters, Spark Lane, Mapplewell, Barnsley, S75 6AB

1. Background

- 1.1 On 17 February 2011, an application under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 was received from Ronald Ford of Costcutters, Spark Lane, Mapplewell, Barnsley. Copy of this application is attached as Appendix 1.
- 1.2 Members are requested to determine the application for a premises licence.
- 1.3 The proposed Costcutter Store is located amongst business and residential dwellings and runs alongside the B6428.

2 Application for Premises Licence

- 2.1 The proposed application requests the licence to take effect from 1st April 2011 and requests the following licensable activity and opening times:
 - i) Sale of Alcohol (Off Sales Only)

Monday to Sunday 07:00 - 22.00

ii) Opening Hours

Monday to Sunday 07.00 - 22.00

3 Promotion of Licensing Objectives

3.1 The applicant has set out the steps intended to be taken in order to promote the four licensing objectives, if the proposed premises licence is granted.

The licensing objectives have been considered in the light of the proposed application, taking into account the premises and the site location.

Details of any measures considered necessary to promote the licensing objectives are contained under the relevant objective below.

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

'As a member of the Costcutter Group, training is always available to our staff to ensure that they promote the four licensing objectives'.

b) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

'We will install CCTV inside and outside the business with full recording. Work directly with the Police and Local Authority'.

c) Public Safety

'Ensure that we follow the rules and regulations of the Environmental Health Act. Full staff training will be given'.

d) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

'We will not sell alcohol to gang's and drunken people. We would report offenders immediately to the Police and provide video evidence.'

e) The Protection of Children from Harm

We will not sell alcohol to children or others buying for children. A refusal record will be kept on site. All tills have a warning flashed on screen asking the assistant if the person in front of them buying alcohol is of age. (this will flash up if any alcohol goes through the till). Full staff training will be on-going.

4 Responsible Authorities

4.1 No representations have been received from Responsible Authorities in this matter.

5 Interested Parties

- 5.1 Following publication of the statutory notice of the premises licence application in the local press and the display of notices at the premises, a significant number of representations have been received from Interested Parties, including one in the form of a petition.
- 5.2 In total, 64 representations have been received, 55 of which were deemed to be invalid. Letters have been sent to those concerned detailing the reasoning behind the invalidity of their representation. However it should be noted that 10 out of the 55 discounted representations have not received a letter, as they failed to supply either an address or an accurate address.
- 5.3 The representations have been received from:

 - N. Kinghorn, 27 Spark Lane, Mapplewell, Barnsley
 - R. Partridge, 68 Pye Avenue, Mapplewell, Barnsley

- N.B. Members are minded to note that a number of names listed on the petition have been discounted. They either do not reside within the immediate vicinity of the proposed store, therefore not considered to be an Interested Party; or the names and/or addresses supplied are either incomplete or illegible and therefore cannot be taken into consideration.
- 5.3 Valid representations which relate to one of more of the four licensing objectives are attached as Appendix 2.
- 5.4 Under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, representations can be made from Interested Parties who live or have any interest in a business that is located within the vicinity of the premises where the application has been made. In this case interested parties concerned reside or run a business in close proximity of where the application has been made.
- 5.4 Each representation sets out a number of areas of concern in relation to the licensing objectives and a précis of these are given below:
 - a) 'Issues relating to under age drinking in the area'.
 - b) 'Heavy traffic along Spark Lane and Four Lane Ends crossroads in Mapplewell has always been a problem. Increased volume of traffic due to delivery vehicles and customer parking will be unmanageable'.
 - c) 'Existing problems related to anti-social behaviour may increase as a result of selling alcohol til late'.
 - d) 'Doubts that an outlet selling alcohol will bring any positive effect to the village, as alcoholism predominant amongst young people'.
 - e) Issue of pedestrian safety. Existing footpath around the location is very narrow and pedestrians have to walk on the road'
 - f) 'Increased availability of alcohol may cause additional problems to arise, particularly in relation to violent crime'.

5.5 The applicant, Ronald Ford has been in close contact with the Licensing Section throughout the application process and has indicated he is willing to work with all parties involved in order to seek resolution to the issues that have arisen.

6. Compatibility with the European Convention on Human Rights

The decision of the Board will amount to a determination of the Council and the rights of the applicant. Therefore, as far as it is possible to do so, the board must comply with the requirements of Article 6 (the write to a fair trial). This means the applicant and should be afforded the right to make oral representations at the meeting.

If Members determine to refuse the application, it is necessary for the reasons to be clearly stated.

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

Premises Licence – Ford News Limited Our client : Asif Rashid - Objector

We act on behalf of Mr. Asif Rashid of Mapplewell Stores, 22 Towngate, Mapplewell, S75 6AT.

Please take this letter as a representation against the grant of the Premises Licence for the Old School House situated at Spark Lane, Mapplewell.

The representation is on the alternative grounds of prevention of crime and disorder, public nuisance and protection of children from harm, arising from the presence of licensed premises.

The application lodged seeks to licence an empty building for the purpose of it becoming a Supermarket with off-sales for the hours of 07.00 to 22.00.

We are grateful to you for providing us with a copy of the Application form, we have considered in particular the steps offered by the Applicant at Part 3 to promote the four licensing objectives.

We will deal with the points raised within Part 3 specifically, however, first we would seek to make representation in respect of the licensing objectives outlined above and our client's general concerns in respect of each.

1. Crime and Disorder.

Police statistics confirm that in January 2011 within the area surrounding the premises, there were some 85 crimes of which 50% (43) related to ant-social behaviour and a further quarter categorised as other crime which includes criminal damage, shop lifting and drug offences. Additionally, there were 14 violent crimes committed which would include up to grievous bodily harm. Of the anti-social behaviour 6 incidents were reported to take place within the immediate vicinity of the proposed location of the new Premises Licence.

It is our client's contention that the area already suffers from significant problems in relation to youth crime, in particular groups of youngsters acting in an

intimidatory manner to other members of the public and creating a fearful environment.

It is our client's contention that the presence of a Supermarket which has the ability to retail alcohol will act as a further magnet to such individuals, thereby encouraging potentially more youths onto the streets of the area and thereby adversely affecting the amenity of all persons residing in the area.

It is our client's contention that no matter what conditions are imposed upon the Premises Licence, the very existence of the premises and the availability of alcohol will cause this situation to arise. Additionally, the increased availability of alcohol may cause additional problems to arise, particularly in relation to violent crime if it is sold to vulnerable individuals or those known to be of an aggressive nature. It is also considered that offences such as shoplifting will increase.

The premises are situated on a narrow lane and are slightly set back from the public highway with a limited forecourt area. It is considered that there is increased risk of crime and disorder in particular with regard to car crime due to this choice of location.

The layout of the highway does not facilitate a reasonable space for the provision of deliveries and as a consequence, it is highly probable that there will be a risk to pedestrians by virtue of the manoeuvring of delivery vehicles along with potential obstruction of the highway (Spark Lane) when deliveries are taking place.

It is considered that these problems will be compounded by the lack of car parking space available at the proposed site. The forecourt to the premises is very limited and it is inevitable that individuals will park along the narrow road way. The impact upon local residents should not be underestimated in this regard, particularly in view of the fact that there are a number of elderly persons in the surrounding accommodation who will experience increased problems in crossing Spark Lane. There is also a school and it is known that recently a vehicle accident occurred virtually at the site location, including a 10 year old who was crossing the road.

2. Prevention of Public Nuisance.

It is our client's contention that the increased traffic will arise from the premises which will cause a noise nuisance to those residing in the immediate vicinity. The hours of operation sought with regard to retail sale of alcohol and opening of the premises is from 07.00 to 22.00. It is considered that in the early morning there will be limited background noise available to mask the sound of vehicles arriving and that this will be audible to local residents. A later start time would be more appropriate. Furthermore, it is noted that the hours the premises are open and the hours for the sale of alcohol are identical. It may be considered in these circumstances for it to be more appropriate for sale of alcohol to finish earlier so as to ensure that all sales are transacted prior to the closure of the premises.

In addition, we anticipate the presence of youths drawn to the premises will increase noise levels during the course of the evening.

3. Protection of Children from Harm.

In view of the crime statistics for the area, there is clearly a potential risk to children from anti-social behaviour and violent crime which is considered to be capable of being compounded by virtue of this application. It is also submitted

that there is potential risk of increased under age sale or proxy purchase. Although the premises are stated to be a Costcutter, it is understood that the premises will operate under a franchise and therefore the potential influence of a large supermarket chain will actually be lacking and it will be down to the individuals who own Ford News Ltd and /or their Designated Premises Supervisor.

It is at this point that we make particular reference to Part 3 of the Application, the steps proposed to promote the four licensing objectives within thhe application are scant. In view of the support allegedly provided by the Costcutter Group, these steps have clearly been drafted by the individual making the application. The support from the larger Company is therefore placed in question and it is considered that the conditions do not adequately promote the four licensing objectives and do not address all the issues which will arise.

We would refer the Committee to the step offered under Prevention of Public Nuisance in that the premises will not sell alcohol "to gangs or drunken people" – it clearly therefore thinks it is appropriate to sell alcohol to single individuals who may be inappropriate. Furthermore, within this section, it does not address why there may be public nuisance and simply appears to take the easy option of reporting situations to the Police rather than stopping them arising. The few other steps tendered are of a similar nature, only taking the position to an initial assessment and not to prevention or cure.

Legal Formalities.

Having reviewed the application, it is unclear who is the Applicant. The Applicant is named as Ronald Ford but this individual does not provide any correspondence address. Additionally, a Company is mentioned. The Licence should be clearer as to who is to be the Premises Licence Holder with a view to future enforcement.

As a separate matter, as a Licensing Authority you can only determine a new Licence Application (by a hearing when representations are received) if you are satisfied that the Applicant has complied with the requirements in respect of advertising (Licensing Act 2003 Section 18(1)(b))

Our client has monitored the display of the Notices at this site. Their observation is that the Notices were difficult to locate, being obscured by the building works ongoing and are white in colour. Given that the advertisement requirements are mandatory, this would appear to be a fatal flaw to the application and we would be pleased to receive your observations and thoughts on the implications arising. If nothing else, a fresh application should, in our opinion be submitted.

We reserve the right to raise other matters which may come to our clients attention at the hearing, if covered by the objectives referred to herein.







To whom it may concern,

It has come to my attention that a shop will soon be opening on the site of the old Denby Dale Shirt Company building. I would like to take the time to air some serious concerns over the proposal.

First and foremost in my mind is the issue of pedestrian safety. The existing footpath around the location is already very narrow, and pedestrians may find themselves having to either walk in the road to avoid on comers or cross to the other side to reach the pavement. In this instance, with no footpath immediate on the other side of the road increased pedestrian traffic may only serve to cause a serious incident. Recently my own daughter was knocked down by a car in front of the Square Chapel flats (opposite the Denby Dale Shirt Company building) as she tried to cross the road, as the pavement terminates at the Square Chapel location. I am happy to provide further information (including any paperwork from the police and hospital) on my daughters accident.

Second is the sudden rise in traffic. If cars are being encouraged to park on the shops site (whether in a car park or on the road) leaving the premises may well cause further difficulties, not only for pedestrians but for other traffic. The Spark Lane junction is already notoriously busy during rush hour, and indeed throughout the day. Having more cars trying to join the road from not only the shop site but also from the nearby garage, nursing home, Square Chapel flats and car park next to the Post Office will only increase the potential for another serious road incident.

I would urge the council to at the very least consider the potential for future accidents, and take preventative measures, such as widening the footpath to accommodate at least two people at any one time, putting in traffic lights at the top junction and install a new pedestrian crossing on the site.

I look forward to receiving your thoughts on the matter.
