



Principal Towns Programme Update Area Council February 8th 2018





- Principal Towns is a £5 million investment project set up to improve local economies in the surrounding areas and help local high streets thrive.
- The programme covers the following Principal towns: Cudworth, Goldthorpe, Hoyland, Penistone, Royston, Wombwell. And the following Local Centres Athersley, Bolton on Dearne, Darfield, Darton, Dodworth, Grimethorpe, Lundwood, Mapplewell, Stairfoot, Thurnscoe.
- □ The programme launched in 2017 and will be running until March 2020
- Principal Towns project is working with local businesses and community organisations to deliver projects focussed on creating a thriving high street and strong and resilient communities.
- Potential projects could include car parking improvements, new signage, shop front improvements and public space improvements. A suggested minimum amount of funding per project has been proposed at £100,000 for Principal Towns and £50,000 for Local Centres.
- These improvements will help encourage investment from the private sector and other funding streams to increase income generation across the borough.
- Initial registration of interests have been submitted for each of the areas

Principal Towns Programme

- □ February 2nd 2017 Principal towns programme outline introduced to Area Council
- Summer 2017 Students from the University of Sheffield invited to provide support to a programme of consultation with residents in the town centre
- Registration of interest submitted to the first Commissioning board in July 2017 with an outline proposal based on recommendations from consultation suggesting a holistic programme of change to the town to enhance and encourage the town as a tourist destination
- Consultation outcomes collated into a short film presented to Area Council December 8th December 2017, published for wider viewing through BMBC web based channels and social

Penistone progress so far

- □ Approval provided from Commissioning Board 25th January 2018 for feasibility study to draw up and cost proposals from the initial registration of interest.
- Landsolve consultants agreed as approved provider to support this process
- Meeting with BMBC assets team January 18th 2018 to look at how to link proposals to maximise building usage and service delivery in Penistone
- Agreed that further consultation required to scope feasibility ensuring wide participation from all stakeholders including outlying areas not just Penistone town centre

Penistone progress so far

- Public consultation events February 8th held in the market barn area, to include further Business engagement.
- Stakeholder event proposal to include Ward Alliance, Parish Councils, Town Council and Area Council to work with Landsolve consultants to shape and scope feasibility study
- Investigate potential to re-design town landscape to improve public areas
- Potential to link to Penistone history scope to develop the Penistone Experience
- Review of town centre car parking
- Other areas for consideration to be determined and factored into plan
