- Supporting volunteering opportunities and social action


### Community Survey methodolgy

- Survey format agreed by Area Council June 13<sup>th</sup> 2019 to ask participants to choose their top 3 priorities from the list
- On-line and paper versions produced and out from end of June to September 15<sup>th</sup>
- Self selecting
- Promoted via Social Media, Penistone FM, Penistone Living article, Parish Councils (seen in magazines), our partners such as Age UK, members of SOPPA, Ward alliance members
- Collection boxes at key locations; Dunford Bridge, TESCO, library, Silkstone Church, Wortley Church, St John community centre, Penistone Town Hall
- Taken out to some groups via Partners and area team

- Not asked to rank these

  - Some from out of area may be people working in Penistone?


# Spread of responses from across the Penistone area
