

Smoking Prevalence



Just over one in four adults in the North East area are smokers. Rates have been consistently higher than the rates for Barnsley at each time point during the period 2013 to 2016. The current rate of 25.5% is the lowest since 2013.





Number of client registrations Nov - Aug 2020-21 and Nov - Aug 2021-22





4 week Quit Rate - Nov 21 - June 22






12 Week Quit Rate
