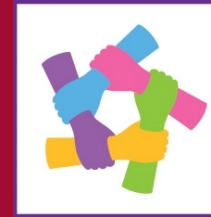

Clear Hold Build - Phases

Theme	Strategic Aim
1. Clear	Reduce Organised Crime in Barnsley through effective problem-solving in partnership, increased engagement with communities and targeted activity to address this crime type.
1. Hold	Successfully deliver counter measures and contingencies to ensure those areas initially made safe remain so and that community perceptions of improved security, reassurance and confidence are not undermined.
1. Build	To create a whole-systems approach to delivering multi-agency and community empowered interventions, creating sustainable resilience and safety within communities to mitigate SOC related harm.



As part of the Clear Phase an in-depth police operation on 27th April 2022
Operation Waste Bravo resulted in:

- 16 individuals pending charges for offences relating to drug supply
- 1 individual has been sentenced to 3 years imprisonment.
- Approx £900,000 of assets frozen.
- Recovery of 30 mobile phones.
- A dedicated CPS lawyer
- Quick-time forensics
- Quick phone downloads



- Creation of Operational Delivery Group meetings led by The Community Safety Partnership Lead
- Identifying key partners to support the delivery of clear, hold, build
- Key partners included: Stronger Communities, South Yorkshire Police, Berneslai Homes, South Yorkshire Fire, Twiggs Environmental Services
- Formulating key action plans to deliver the hold phase
- Terms of Reference for the delivery of CHB created and agreed by all members of the ODG.

- Multiple complaints from neighbouring residents

Clear Hold Build – Actions Completed

- Prospect Flats, West Street Hoyland:
- SYP worked jointly with owners of the building
- Implemented a selective lettings policy to improve residents residing at the facility
- Daily visits by SYP to disrupt criminal activity
- Fencing requested to the rear to prevent individuals accessing the back of the property
- Regular contact with neighbours re CCTV/activity
- ASB survey conducted with local residents in Oct 2021 followed up in March 2023 – showing a dramatic reduction in ASB in this area

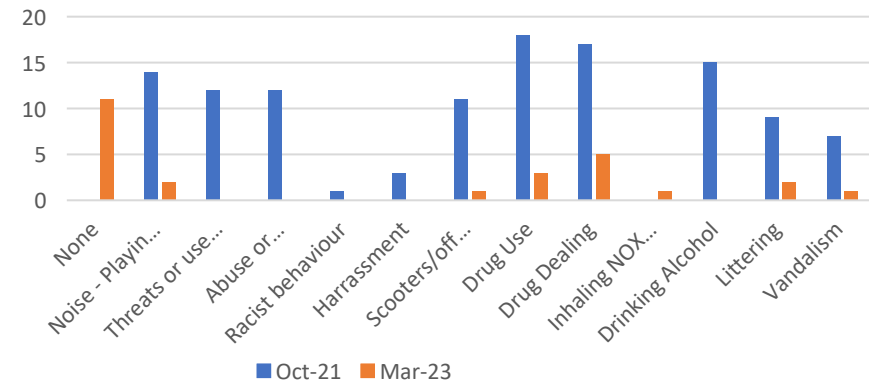

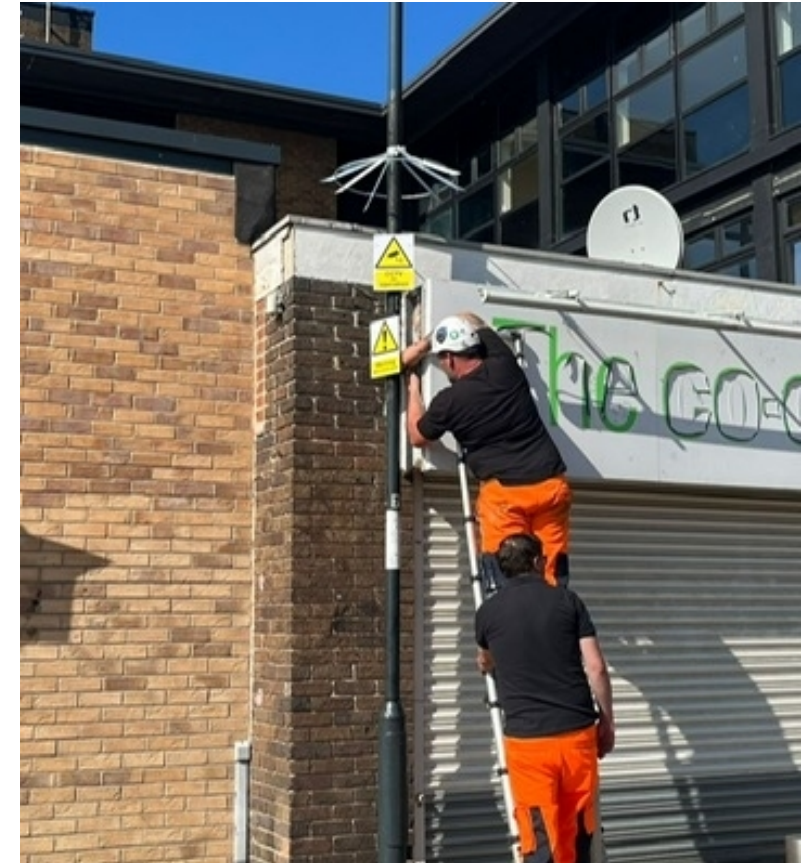

What ASB do you suffer from (mark all that apply).





- Reports of youths causing ASB, climbing on roofs and market stalls
- Utilised safer street funding to purchase anti-vandal paint and anti-climb spikes and signage
- By working in partnership with South Yorkshire Police we were able to identify youths causing issues from CCTV footage.
- BMBC wardens and staff from SYP Neighbourhood Teams jointly visited the parents of the youths resulting in 2 ASB warning letter being served, and words of advice being given to the parents and youths known to be involved in the incidents.
- No further incidents of ASB reported in this area

Safer Streets 4 funding

Safer Neighbourhood Service were successful in securing Safer Streets 4 via the Police and Crime Commissioner.

As part of the wider bid the South area were allocated £30,000 across Lloyland Milton (£5000), Rockingham (£5000), Wombwell (£10,000) and Darfield (£10,000) wards.

The funding was to increase the feeling of safety and reduce the fear of crime whilst supporting the following themes:

- Tackling neighbourhood crime.
- Tackling anti-social behaviour.
- Tackling violence against women and girls.
- Improving the safety of public spaces for all.



Darfield

- £10,000 funding from Safer streets
- Long standing issue with off road biking / quads/ burning out vehicles
- Residential area, next to a school, main walkway for residents
- Utilise funds to do other side of field area – Inkerman significant reduction after fence was put up, like for like
- Have seen a reduction in the field being torn up / reduced number of complaints

Wombwell Premier Kicks

During the period 01/06/2023 – 30/08/2023 Premier League Kicks delivered sessions in Wombwell, providing sports provision and opportunities to young people with the aim to reduce anti-social behaviour and increase sports participation.

Engaged 59 young people aged between 8-19yrs, with 45 identifying as Male and 14 identifying as Female.

- Weekly sessions at Netherwood Academy and Wombwell Park. Wombwell Park: 1-hour multi-sport/football coaching and Netherwood Academy: 2 hours
- Reds used social media platforms, Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter to promote along with flyer drops into local primary schools and Netherwood Academy.
- They worked closely with local partners and authorities including the Youth Offending Team, local family centre as well as attending a Health and Wellbeing fair at Netherwood Academy on the 26th June.
