The ward alliance would like to look at planting a number of sustainable Christmas trees in the ward, as we felt the project Dodworth Ward Alliance did was wonderful and fits our green agenda. • Hanging Baskets: KMO Ltd are the new providers and the procurement exercise as seen the cost of a basket increase to £110. The Ward Alliance discussed progressing with the scheme over the next week or so to gauge interest and try to expand. • Environment: A meeting will be put in place once all the hanging basket work has been confirmed, this meeting will provide the public with an opportunity to support and influence our green agenda and future projects. • Artwork: Progressing on our Telecommunications Artwork project, we have Creative Recovery who will be supporting at least one more from funding already paid out and we have a volunteer to do one. For the volunteer lead, we will need to send out the information to the local street to ensure they are happy with it. We will also work with an out of the area school keen on the project too. • Defibrillators: The ward is happy with the mapping and will now look at the costs of the project before they progress. • Benches: the ward alliance have identified a number of areas and will now look at the costs of the project.
