SCHOOL PLACEMENT AND SUFFICIENCY STRATEGY FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE WITH SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS (2017-20): EXPANSION OF ADDITIONAL RESOURCE UNIT AT HOYLAND SPRINGWOOD PRIMARY ACADEMY

Introduction

The overriding objective of the School Placement and Sufficiency Strategy for Children and Young People with Special Educational Needs, including a disability (SEN(D)) is to meet these needs, closer to home, through investing in and improving both capacity and quality within local mainstream and special schools.

As a result, this report proposes the approval of expenditure to make the required adaptations at Hoyland Springwood Primary Academy in order to create placements for up to 10 children aged 5 to 11 each of whom has been diagnosed with or is awaiting a diagnosis of complex needs, with effect from April 2020.

A summary of the costs of the proposal is set out as follows:

Capital costs

Building:

£75,000

Grounds:

£25,000

Maintenance costs:

£2,450

Sensory room:

£4,000

Classroom furniture:

£16.000

ICT equipment:

£14,700

Total capital expenditure = £ 137,150

The above will be funded from the DfE's SEN(D) special provision capital funding. The DfE has allocated Barnsley £1.3m capital funding (over 3 years) to fund increases in SEND places and to improve existing SEND facilities and provision.

Revenue costs

Total funding:

£250,000 (based upon the placement of up to 10 pupils at

£25,000 per pupil

The cost per pupil comprises of place funding of £10,000 and top up funding of £15,000. Actual top up funding will be dependent on the actual number of pupils

placed at the provision. Funding for the above provision has been allowed for in the latest SEN(D) cost projections / model (High needs budget) and is in lieu of more expensive out of authority placements.

The decision to approve the use of DfE funding and to authorise such revenue expenditure for this purpose is taken in accordance with the Council's Scheme of Delegation limits, originally agreed by Full Council at its meeting held on 24th November 2014. It is derived from the strategic objectives of the Borough's School Placement and Sufficiency Strategy for Children and Young People with SEN(D) which was approved for adoption by Cabinet at the meeting held on 15th November 2017 (*Minute Reference: Cabinet 15.11.2017/11*). This specific proposal is to be agreed, in principle, by the Capital Oversight Board and has the support of the Every Child Matters Multi-Academy Trust, which is the sponsoring body for Hoyland Springwood Primary Academy.

Key Risks Associated With The Proposed Action

No such risks have been identified as a result of this proposal (*Please also see below*)

Decision Taken

Approval is given to authorise expenditure, amounting to a total of £387,150, for the purpose of refurbishing the Additional Resource Unit at Hoyland Springwood Primary Academy. This will help provide up to 10 quality placements for children aged 5-11 who have been diagnosed with complex needs and thereby prevent these young and vulnerable children from being placed in more costly, independent provision out of the Borough. This decision will ensure greater value for money and the more effective use of available resources.
